Dansville Central High wrestlers copped seven of the 12 Livingston County championship titles here Monday evening to maintain their stranglehold over area grappling teams.

All seven Red and Black groaners, along with the other five title holders will travel to Spencerport Saturday for the Section V Class "A" quarter-final matches. Wellsville was due in town last evening to give the locals a warmup test and Livonia will be in for a match Tuesday evening at 7 o'clock.

Tom Jenkins took the 95-lb. title, scoring a 4-2 decision over Marty Sintzenich of Livonia although Sintzenich's brother, Howard, gained revenge by besting Dansville's Jerry Harter in the 103-lb. division bout.

Unbeaten Harold Johnson continued to pace the local team, grinding out an 8-0 decision over Milich Griffin of Geneseo in the 120-lb. contest and Bob Lauffer put on the 127-lb. crown by pinning Ray Claud of Geneseo.

Dansville's Carleton Allen was a 3-0 winner over Al DiFranco of Geneseo in the 133-lb. class battle. Mike Harter tagged a pin defeat on Bill Dantz of Geneseo in the 138-lb. tussle for another Dansville victory.

Dave Ross was a 3-0 winner over Tom Lowery of Livonia in the 154-lb. fight to give Coach John Ordiway's club another victory and Jerry Lander added the seventh verdict by pinning Geneseo's Mike Foose in the 165-lb. test.

The 112-lb. title went to Tom Ferrara of Geneseo who whipped Dave MacArthur of Livonia, 5-0. Tom Wright is the 145-lb. champ by virtue of his win over Art Comer of Geneseo and Paul Vaccaro of Livonia took the 175-lb. title by whipping Dansville's Dick Smith, 9-2.

Gerry Loomis of Caledonia was a 6-0 winner in the unlimited class over Livonia's Gerry Grisby.
