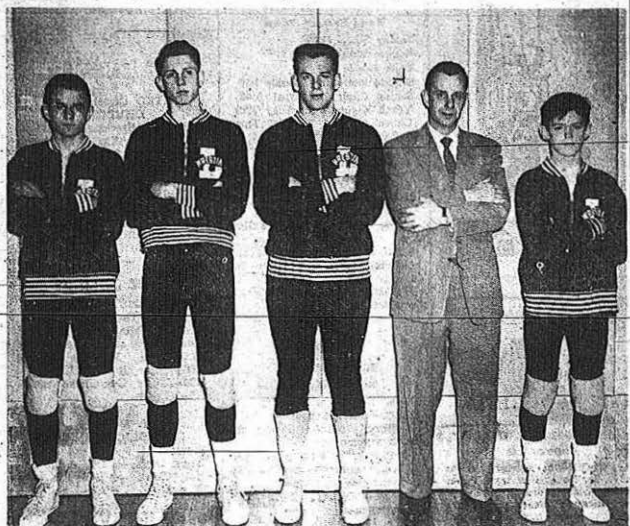


Four County Wrestling Champions from Letchworth Central; Hale and Bliss, Section V Champs Last Year, Take Honors Again
