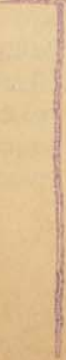

Eastridge was the only high school wrestling team in Monroe County to remain unbeaten in dual meet action throughout all of 1966.

VICTORY OVER SPENCERPORT

Eastridge grapplers downed Spencerport last Thursday and brought the League record to an impressive 4-0. The Lancers are 5-0 overall.

Ron Pierce pinned Mike Van Schoick in the 97 pound class to start the ball rolling. Bill Prince got a pin at 114, followed by an upset victory for Bruce Prince over Rick Hilsinger, 7-4. Tom Scalzo, Tom Arataari, Paul Grzynkowski and Jim DeMarco were the other winners.

SCALZO RETURNS JANUARY 21st

Chris Scalzo returns to the mats on January 21 as BK comes to Eastridge at 8 pm. Scalzo, who has been out with a knee injury, will probably wrestle John Nemetko (167) or Emmett Whalen (156).

Of the four Lancer matmen who won their matches, all scored pins. These grapplers were Ron Pierce (97), Tom Scalzo (135), Jim Nowak (140), Paul Grzynkowski (167). Dan Street, wrestling at 129 pounds, scored some sort of an upset as he tied Tom Eggleston of the Ridgemen, 1-1.

Eastridge gets another shot at Webster on February 11, provided Webster beats East Rochester on Saturday and Eastridge beats Irondequoit, February 8.

One possible reason for the loss was that heavyweight Jim DeMarco had a bad case of the flu. Another would be the absence of Chris Scalzo.
