

Southwestern Wrestlers Snap Portville's 6-Year, 84-Meet Win Streak

After six years without losing a meet Portville finally met its match last night as hosting Southwestern snapped the Panthers' 84 straight winning streak and recorded its first wrestling victory of the season.

Southwestern led all the way in the 36-17 win. Dave Denn, the Trojans' 187-pounder, put the cap on the meet for the home team with a fall. The score was 13-11 after Denn dazed the referee (rule) on his oppo-

nent in 1:19.

The Trojans took a fast 13-0 lead by winning the first three matches. Greg White won, 12-2, at 88; Bob Moberg used a double arm bar for the count in 2:16 at 105 and Doug Traver won, 5-0, at the 112 match.

Portville's Joe Swanson slipped the half and crotch on his opponent in the 118-bout for the fall in 4:44.

Jeff Swan pinned his man in 4:33 in the 126-bout by use of the cradle or put Southwestern up six more.

Bruce Martin won, 7-2, in

the 132-clash for the Trojans.

Southwestern's Dan Golando and Portville's Jim Faulkner tied at 13 apiece in a hard fought 138-battle. Both wrestlers scored seven points in the second period by use of take downs, reversals and near falls. Golando had to play catch-up in the final period as he was down by four. The Southwestern grappler scored on a stalling call to tie it up in the final seconds.

Mark McMaster won, 5-

2, for the Trojans at 145 and in return Portville's Tim Miller wrestled to an 8-0 decision at 155.

Denn did his thing at 167 then Portville's Don Mulleary came back with a pin at 177. He also used the cradle for the count in 5:37.

Hill Reynolds worked in the half and crotch for the fall in 1:53 for the Trojans in the heavyweight bout.

Steve Blake pinned Portville's Jerry Christopher in 1:36 in the optional 88-pound weight class. Blake

used a stack for the fall, which does not count towards team points.

Southwestern Coach Clarence (Flash) Olson commented, "It was a highly competitive meet and our wrestlers were ready. Everyone wrestled their own match, they worked and we won."

Gowanda beat Portville in the 1966 season and since then the Panthers have been undefeated. Southwestern's triumph marked the sixth time that Portville has been beaten

in wrestling in the school's history.

Portville Coach Joel Fowler, now in the varsity scene after three years in the assistant's position, commented, "we wrestled a better team. We have four sophomores and two freshmen on our squad and as a young team I'm pleased with my boy's performances."

Greg White, Bob Moberg, Doug Traver and Jeff Swan all held 3-0 records on the Trojans' team. Swan recorded his

third pin last night.

Portville's overall record is now 38-6.

Southwestern travels to Falconer tomorrow and Saturday for the Southern Tier Holiday Tournament.
