## 1969 TOURNAMENT OUTLOOK

The 1969 Tournament will again see an increase in teams; sixteen colleges have entered wrestlers. Competition for individual championship should be outstanding; every weight class has two or three outstanding wrestlers. The Seeding Committee will be hard-pressed to determine the seed.

Morrisville Ag. & Tech., again looks like the pre-tourney favorite. Ranked eighth nationally, the powerful Mustangs will be hard to displace. Returning champions, Spohn and Morgan, provide the experienced nucleus for five freshmen teammates, Welch, Paratore, German and Campbell.

Corning, Alfred and Cobleskill all have outside possibilities of upsetting Morrisville. Each squad has the 3 or 4 possible champions, but as usual, the draw will determine many of the consolation team points, so necessary, to the eventual champion.

## TOURNAMENT TEAM SCORING

1. Places - In tournaments, first place in each weight class shall count 10 points; second place, 7 points; third place, 4 points; and fourth place, 2 points. These points shall be awarded as soon as earned. At the conclusion of the championship semi-finals, each winner shall receive seven points. At the conclusion of the championship finals, each winner shall receive three additional points, each loser, no additional points. At the conclusion of the consolation semi-finals, each winner shall receive two points. At the conclusion of the final third place matches, each winner shall receive two additional points, each loser no additional points. One additional point shall be scored for each match won by a fall, default or forfeit throughout the tournament.
2. Advancement Points - In addition, one point shall be scored for each match won in both the championship and consolation eliminations except for the final first and third place matches. No points are awarded for a bye in any round.
