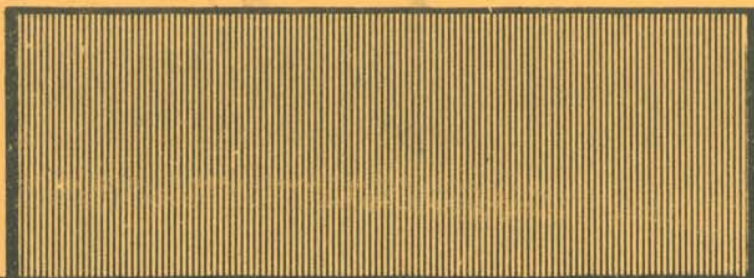


Dear Wrestlers, Coaches, and Fans:

## TOURNAMENT TEAM SCORING

1. Places - In tournaments, first place in each weight class shall count 10 points; second place, 7 points; third place, 4 points; and fourth place, 2 points. These points shall be awarded as soon as earned. At the conclusion of the championship semi-finals, each winner shall receive seven points. At the conclusion of the championship finals, each winner shall receive three additional points, each loser, no additional points. At the conclusion of the consolation semi-finals, each winner shall receive two points. At the conclusion of the final third place matches, each winner shall receive two additional points, each loser no additional points. One additional point shall be scored for each match won by a fall, default or forfeit throughout the tournament.
2. Advancement Points - In addition, one point shall be scored for each match won in both the championship and consolation eliminations except for the final first and third place matches. No points are awarded for a bye in any round.

## 1970 Tourney Outlook

The 1970 Region III NJCAA Tournament, increased to a seventeen team field, should prove one of the closest in the eight year history of the event. Outstanding wrestlers dominate each of the ten weight classes with the number of unbeatens becoming progressively smaller as the tourney deadline approaches.

The pre-tourney favorites would appear to be Alfred Tech, Corning Community College and Morrisville Tech, who boast strong well balanced squads though the 1969 champion Cobleskill "Aggies" the host Delhi Tech, Broncos, Broome Tech, Adirondack Community College and Hudson Valley Community College all loom as possible dark horses.

Alfred Tech. is led by four unbeatens, Bert Nagle 150#, Tom Rauilli 158#, Ron Tojkowski 167# and John Drisdon 190#.

Ed Michael's Corning Club is well balanced with Bob Veres, undefeated 118#, Darrell Wright 158#, Jim Carr 177#, Tony Policare 190# and heavy Terry Arman.

Morrisville Tech's Mustangs will go with a veteran lineup which includes Don Campbell 142# unbeaten, Paul Paratore, also undefeated at 177#, Gary Campbell 190# and Bob German (HWT).

The defending Champion, Cobleskill Tech. has strong contenders in Brian Houlehan 118# '69 regional champion and NJCAA place winner Mark Beckerman, 126# Foster 134# and Harrington 167#.

The Delhi host Broncos have '69 regional champion Robbie Waller 150#, Roger Ingalls 158# undefeated, Mike Waller 134#, Jim McCloe 126#, Dale Graham 118# and '69 regional runner-up Jim Oliver at HWT.
