Gowanda Adds Wrestling Prestige In Holiday Tourney

FALCONER-Gowanda. which holds more records in the Southern Tier Wrestling Conference than the rest of the nine teams combined. added one more to its seemingly invincible list, taking top honors in the first Holiday Tournament here last night.

With five of its grapplers making the first team, the Panthers romped to 97 points while its closest contender, Falconer, ended up
