ABOUT ITHACA COLLEGE

With an enrollment of 6,400 students, Ithaca College is the largest private residential college in New York State. Its 13:1 student-faculty ratio allows a substantial degree of individual attention, yet the College provides a diversity of educational opportunities generally found only at large universities. Indeed, its five schools—Business, Communications, Health Sciences and Human Performance, Humanities and Sciences, and Music—offer some 90 degree programs and over 1400 courses.

From its founding in 1892 as a conservatory of music, Ithaca has had a distinctive and distinguished history of interweaving the threads of liberal and professional education. By 1931 the conservatory had evolved into a private college that offered academic programs in several

professional fields. At mid-century the institution's curricula in liberal arts were unified, and the large and diversified School of Humanities and Sciences now forms the core of the Ithaca educational experience.


As a comprehensive college, Ithaca offers an excellent foundation in the liberal arts as well as strong professional programs at the undergraduate level. Moreover, all its degree programs are supplemented by independent and interdisciplinary studies, dual majors, minors, and elective courses in other academic fields.

Education at Ithaca is not limited to the classroom. For example, undergraduates may student-teach in public schools, undertake internships with corporations and other professional organizations, and

spend a semester abroad at the College's London Center. There are also opportunities for participating in community service projects and taking courses at Cornell University under a cooperative exchange program.

Ithaca's modern campus is the result of a remarkable transformation begun in 1960, when the College moved from Victorian buildings scattered throughout the downtown area to a hill south of the city. The College's present site commands a spectacular view of Cayuga Lake, largest of New York's Finger Lakes, and the City of Ithaca, a cosmopolitan community with a population of 29,000. Located in New York's Southern Tier, Ithaca is 4 1/2 hours by car from New York City, 3 hours from Albany, and 3 1/2 hours from Buffalo.







BOMBERS CLAIM 1989 NCAA WRESTLING CHAMPIONSHIP

Five All-America wrestlers helped carry Ithaca College to the 1989 NCAA Division III Wrestling Championship at John Carroll University. The championship capped off a remarkable eight-month stretch for Ithaca's athletic program that included Division III crowns in baseball and football. The Bomber grapplers, who out-tallied second place Delaware Valley, 72.5–64.5, managed to take the title without the benefit of an individual champion.

"We won it with our balance," said Ithaca mentor John Murray, voted NCAA Division III Wrestling Coach of the Year by his peers. "We wrestled well throughout the tournament and gained some valuable points with pins and superior

decisions along the way.

"We knew we needed a team effort,"
Murray said. "Since we didn't have one
or two dominant wrestlers, I told the
team it was very important that we
advance three wrestlers into the finals."
His charges heeded the advice, as five
wrestlers advanced to the All-America
round and three earned spots in championship bouts.


Ithaca had knocked on the national championship door in the 1988 NCAA tournament at Wheaton College. After earning the top ranking during the regular season, Ithaca qualified 10 wrestlers for the nationals. Although the squad performed admirably, especially individual national titlist Mike Cronmiller, their effort fell short and the Bombers placed third.

The experience gained, however, would prove quite valuable 12 months later, as six of the seven Ithaca wrestlers who had qualified for the 1989 tournament appeared in the event the previous year.

"I think our experience helped a lot," said Ithaca 190-pounder Mike Fusilli. "Knowing what the environment would be like and how the crowd would be was a big factor."

"We weren't in awe when we got there," added Bomber captain Joel Lamson. "We knew what level of competition we would be facing."

Ron Gross capped off a fantastic tournament with a second-place finish at 142 pounds. Gross pinned his first two opponents, won superior decisions in the quarterfinals and semifinals, and only lost in the championship bout to three-time national titlist Shaun Smith of Delaware Valley. Dan Bieller claimed four matches by decision at 177 before losing in the finals,

4–3, to **Kevin Higgins** of Baldwin-Wallace. **Fusilli** completed Ithaca's trio of second-placers with four triumphs by decision — including two in overtime — before dropping the 190-pound final by a 3–2 count to **Dean Gavin** of Wartburg.

Lamson placed fifth at 126 pounds. Knocked out of the championship bracket by eventual runner-up Pete Hayek of John Carroll by a 3-2 decision, Lamson then edged Oneonta State's Dave Regina, 1-0, in overtime, to earn fifth. Marty Nichols was beaten in the 150-pound semifinals by eventual champ Karl Monaco of Montclair State but rebounded by pinning Travis Young of Simpson in the fifth-place matchup. Although they didn't earn All-America recognition, 134-pounder Tim Cotter and heavyweight Randy Cotton contributed to Ithaca's success.

Once again, the Division III Wrestling Championships offered a number of exciting highlights in addition to the team title

Delaware Valley may have fallen short in the crown chase but the Aggies produced three individual champs. Shaun Smith won a third title at 142 pounds with his 15-4 decision over Ithaca's Gross. Smith had captured first place in 1985 and 1986, as well. Mark Ambrose, the runnerup in 1988, claimed the 158-pound class by edging Eric Stewart of Central, 6-2. At 167 pounds, Randy Worrell downed Joe Schmidt from the host school, 6-3.

The tournament wouldn't have been complete without Montclair State being a factor, and the Indians were, placing sixth. Pete Gonzalez won his second crown at 126 pounds and was named the championship's outstanding wrestler after recording three pins, including one in the finals against Pete Hayek of John Carroll. Teammate Karl Monaco won his third individual title, adding the 150-pound award to a trophy collection that includes two 142-pound firsts. He decisioned Cortland's Dave Zariczny, 9-2, in the final's bout.

Buena Vista's **Dave Jordan** improved on his sixth-place finish in 1988 by taking the 118-pound crown. He narrowly defeated **Joe Dasti** of Kean, 2-1. In the 134-pound class, **Bob Berceau** of Wisconsin-Stevens Point knocked out defending champion **John Beatty** of Augsburg, 6-2, in the semifinals, and in the finals downed **Chris Cuffari** of Trenton State, 2-0, in overtime.

Kevin Higgins of Baldwin-Wallace made his 100th career victory count as it earned him a national title at 177. Higgins was triumphant in another thrilling final, edging Ithaca's Bieller, 4-3. Ohio Northern's Vince Cameron captured the heavyweight crown with a 5-2 overtime win in a matchup with Central's Scott Dierks.

Among the other top team finishers, Augsburg wrestled its way to third place with 61.5 points. Host John Carroll delighted the partisan crowd by earning fourth, just 13.5 points behind title-winning Ithaca.

ITHACA CAPS 50TH SEASON OF WRESTLING EXCELLENCE BY HOSTING NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

One of the most successful wrestling programs in the Division III ranks, Ithaca College enters the 1990 Championships as both defending titlist and host. The event caps off the school's fiftieth season

of intercollegiate wrestling.


Ithaca wrestling had its beginning in 1930 at the Seneca Gym in downtown Ithaca under the direction of Walter O'Connell. O'Connell had experience at starting wrestling programs, having done the same for neighboring Cornell University in 1908. Although his record at Ithaca was a modest 8–17–1 in six seasons, his efforts as the sport's founding father set the stage for a successful future for wrestling at the College.

The program was temporarily discontinued in 1936, but brought back to life by O'Connell protege and former Ithaca captain Clyde "Whitey" Cole following World War II in 1946. Then-president Leonard Job, himself a wrestler as an undergraduate at Indiana University, also

played a key role in the rebirth.

A standout during Cole's four-year tenure was Jim LaRock. Unbeaten in four years of dual-meet competition with 31 wins and 26 falls, LaRock developed into one of the top 165-pound wrestlers in the nation. While at Ithaca he earned a second place finish in the NCAA tournament to land All-America honors, won national YMCA and AAU championships, and gained a spot on the 1952 U.S Olympic team.

Former Cole assistant Herbert Broadwell took over the head coaching reins in 1950 and embarked on a 20-year career at Ithaca that produced 99 victories and six All-Americas. Jim Howard earned the honor twice at 130 pounds, finishing third and second in the NCAA tournament in 1953 and 1954, respectively. Bob Marella was Ithaca's first All-America in the heavyweight division, placing second at the NCAA's in 1959. He went on to a professional wrestling career as "Gorilla Monsoon" and currently works as a television commentator for the World Wrestling Federation, which has held shows in Ithaca's Ben Light Gymnasium benefitting the Bomber program.




Mike Cronmiller, Ithaca's first male individual national champion

Jack Stanbro followed Marella with a national second at heavyweight in 1960, and Orlando Iacovelli wrestled to third at 147 in 1962. Terry Habecker rounded out the list of All-America wrestlers under Broadwell by placing fourth at 137 pounds in 1969.

The program's fortunes sagged in the 1970s, although Paul Iacovelli, Ron King and Ralph Salem were All-Americas. Ithaca was 45–59 in the decade under four different coaches.

The hiring of current coach John Murray coincided with the efforts of athletic director Robert Deming to restore Ithaca's winning tradition. The hard work paid almost immediate dividends, as Murray has forged a 112-33 record since taking command in 1980. Ithaca has put together two undefeated dual-meet campaigns and seven straight top 15 finishes at the Division III championships during his tenure. Murray has been blessed with 27 All-America honors from 17 wrestlers, including three-time winners Bart Morrow and Bob Panariello.

The 1988 squad came close to the team

title after posting a 15–0 regular-season mark. Mike Cronmiller became the first individual male sport champion in Bomber history when he grappled to the 158-pound title. Murray's men had six All-Americas that year, and with four returners in the bunch another run at the championship in 1989 was a distinct possibility that became a reality.

"When I began at Ithaca, winning the championship was just a dream," recalled Murray, the winningest coach in Bomber wrestling history. "In the past few years, with our success, it began to look more real. I'm very happy for our kids."

The wrestling program, one of 24 intercollegiate sports at Ithaca College, has been a key contributor to the school's athletic success. The institution's Sports Hall of Fame includes seven members of the Bomber wrestling family. Those honored, with their year of induction, are: Herb Broadwell (1989), Clyde Cole (1971), Terry Habecker (1979), Jim Howard (1969), Orlando Iacovelli (1987), Jim LaRock (1969), Bob Marella (1973), and Jack Stanbro (1984).



How to Keep Individual & Team Scoring

MATCH:

Seven minutes in length, three minutes first period, two minutes second and third periods.

Wrestlers begin in stand-up neutral positions. A coin toss will decide which contestant has his choice of position in the second period. The wrestler with the choice option can select up, down or neutral positions, or defer his choice to his opponent. The participant who does not choose a position in the second period has choice of up, down or neutral position in the third period.

Wrestlers score points in this manner:

Near fall: 2 or 3 points

Take down: 2 points

Reversal: 2 points

Escape: 1 point

*Time advantage: 1 point

*Time advantage is awarded if a wrestler accumulates one minute or more in the advantage position over his opponent.

A fall, which ends the bout, occurs when a wrestler holds his opponents shoulder or scapulas to the mat for one second. A default occurs when a wrestler is unable to continue because of injury. Penalty points are earned by the offended wrestler when a referee indicates unnecessary roughing (intentional striking, gouging, kicking, hair pulling, butting, elbowing or any intentional act which endangers life or limb), illegal holds or technical violations according to the infraction penalty table.

In the event that the opponents are tied at the end of regulation, there are three extra periods of overtime, one minute each. If the opponents are still tied after overtime, a criteria decision (CD) is made in the following order:

- a) abusive and unsportsmanlike conduct penalties
- b) near falls
- c) takedowns
- d) reversals
- e) escapes
- f) riding time (must have 15 seconds more than opponent)
- g) stalling (penalized or warned)
- h) illegal holds
- i) technical violations and unnecessary roughness
- j) time advantage
- k) regular match (a thru i criteria to apply to regulation)
- 1) referee decision





Glossary of Terms

BYE-If fewer than eight wrestlers are in a weight, a number of wrestlers will be passed to the next round automatically.

DECISION-If no fall occurs in three periods, the contestant scoring the greater number of points will be declared the winner by decision.

DEFAULT-One of the wrestlers is unable to continue wrestling for any reason.

DEFENSIVE STARTING POSITION-Defensive wrestler is on his hands and knees in the center of the mat and faces away from the timers' table. Both knees must be kept on the mat. The heels of both hands must be on the mat. The elbows shall not touch the mat.

DISQUALIFICATION-A wrestler is banned from competition for flagrant misconduct, greasy substance on skin, objectionable pads and braces, illegal equipment or illegal costume. Also occurs after the third penalty for illegal holds, technical violations, stalling or unnecessary roughness.

ESCAPE-When the defensive wrestler gains a neutral position and the offensive wrestler has lost control.

FALL-Any part of both shoulders or area of both scapulas held in contact with the mat for one second. The shoulders must not be out-of-bounds.

FLAGRANT MISCONDUT-Unnecessary roughness or abusive conduct determined by the referee to be flagrant. One team point is deducted.

FORFEIT-Received by a wrestler when his opponent, for any reason, fails to appear for the match. Wrestler receiving a forfeit must be dressed to wrestle at matside.

ILLEGAL HOLDS-Any hold which is considered potentially dangerous and risks injury.

INTERLOCKING HANDS-A wrestler in the advantage position may not lock or overlap his hands, fingers or arms around his opponent's body or both legs unless the opponent has all of his weight supported on his feet or has him in a pinning situation.

MAJOR DECISION-Decision by between 8 and 14 points.

NEUTRAL SITUATION-One in which neither wrestler has

NEAR FALL-Offensive wrestler has control of his opponent in a pinning situation with both shoulders or both scapulas touching the mat; or when the wrestler is held in a high bridge or on both elbows; or when one shoulder is held touching the mat and the other shoulder is held at an angle of 45 degrees or less; or both scapulas are held four inches from the mat. If these conditions are met, the referee awards two points to the offensive wrestler only when the defensive wrestler frees himself from the pinning position. If the near fall occurs uninterrupted for five seconds, the offensive wrestler is awarded three points. A continuous roll-through is not a near fall.

OFFENSIVE STARTING POSITION-Offensive wrestler on the right or left side of his opponent with at least one knee on the mat and his head on the mid-line of his opponent's body. Near arm is placed loosely around the opponent's body. Other arm is on the back of the opponent's near elbow. One knee must touch the mat. One knee or foot shall be on the mat outside of the opponent's near leg, not touching the opponent. Other knee or foot may be in back of the opponent's feet.

OUT OF BOUNDS-When the supporting parts of neither wrestler are inside the boundry.

OVERTIME-In tournaments only, when the match ends in tie, contestants will wrestle three extra periods of one minute each. A one minute rest period will be allowed before overtime begins. The competitors will begin overtime in the standing position, and overtime will be conducted in the same manner as a regular match. In the event of a tie after overtime, a set of criteria will be used to determine the winner.

POSITION OF ADVANTAGE-A contestant is in control and maintaining restraining power over his opponent.

REVERSAL-When the defensive wrestler comes from underneath and gains control of his opponent, either on the mat or standing. Supporting points must be within the wrestling area.

STALEMATE-A position other than a pinning situation in which neither wrestler can improve his position.

STALLING-When a contestant does not make an honest attempt to stay in the circle and wrestle aggressively. A penalty is preceded by only one warning.

SUPPORTING POINTS-Parts of the body touching the mat and bearing the wrestler's weight, other than those parts which he holds his opponent. When on the mat, the usual points of support may be hands, feet, knees, side of the thigh, and buttocks.

TAKEDOWN-From a neutral position, a contestant gains control and places his opponent's supporting points down on the mat and holds there beyond reaction time. Supporting points of either wrestler must be within the wrestling area.

TECHNICAL FALL-Match concludes by virtue of point margin reaching or exceeding 15 points.

TECHNICAL VIOLATIONS-Conduct which interrupts the continuity of a wrestling match. In most cases, they are preceded by a warning or caution from the referee. Any of a series of stalling movements that are repeated from the neutral, advantage or defensive positions. Technical violations also include a wrestler in the position of advantage who interlocks his hands, the figure four scissors when used by the offensive wrestler around the body or both legs of his opponent, grasping clothing or equipment, leaving the wrestling area without permission, false starts and starting positions. The penalty for a technical violation is one point for the first and second violations, two points for the third one, and disqualification thereafter. Misconduct by either wrestler includes swearing, throwing headgear, or indicating displeasure with a decision and shall be treated as a technical violation, Disqualification due to technical violations, illegal holds or unnecessary roughness does not eliminate a contestant from further tournament competition.

THREE-POINT NEAR-FALL-When the near-fall criteria have been met uninterrupted for five full seconds. Only the wrestler with the advantage may score a near fall.

TIME ADVANTAGE-A wrestler who is in control in gaining advantage. If one wrestler has an advantage of a minute or more, he is awarded a maximum of one point.

Scholar All-Americans

The NCAA Division III Wrestling Coaches Association established its Academic All-American Program in 1985 to honor the sport's top student-athletes for their accomplishments both on the mat and in the classroom. To be nominated, a wrestler must have earned a minimum 3.2 grade point average (on a 4.0 scale), for the previous academic year at his institution, and be of high moral character.

In addition, he must have been a conference or regional placewinner or have compiled a 67 percent winning record while competing in at least two-thirds of his institution's dual meets and NCAA-sanctioned tournaments.

The 1990 team will be selected this weekend, and the names will be announced at Saturday's meeting of the NCAA Division III Wrestling Coaches Association.


