They were the only Section Three wrestlers in the finals.

Pauley (30-3, 50-7) and Gumble, both sophomores, wrestled to a 2-2 tie after regulation and were knotted 0-0 after the overtime period. Pauley was eventually awarded the victory on a referee's criteria decision number three, which is based on most takedowns. Because Pauley had the only takedown, he was victorious. Pauley had topped Jeff Grossfeld of Massapequa-8, 3-2, in a semifinal bout earlier in the day.

Matteson, a junior with a 33-1 season record and a 69-17-3 mark overal, won his semifinal, 7-4, over Joe Chetti of North Babylon-11 in the morning and then came back to top Gailo.
