



THE TEAM TITLE - WHO'S NO. 1?

Once again Central New York is serving as host for the New York State Intersectional Wrestling Meet and if this year's 13th annual tournament is similar to last year's exciting event, you will be witnessing superb individual and team competition.

Those of you who were in attendance last March will recall that the closest Sectional team point race in history took place, with section Eleven (Suffolk County, L.I.) finally winning with 98% points. Then, in a tightly-bunched pack, came Sections Five (Rochester area) with 97, Section Six (Western New York) at 93%, Section Three (Central New York) with 88%, Section Four (Binghamton-Ithaca area) at 87 and Section Eight (Nassau County, L.I.) with 81

The victory by Section Eleven enabled Long Island representatives to continue their glittering record at the expense of their Upstate cohorts. At the previous 12 Intersectional Tournaments, athletes from Sections Eight and Eleven have provided the team champion on eight occasions. The only breakthroughs in the struggle for team titles occurred when Section Four (Southern Tier) won in 1965 and 1969, and when Section Three triumphed in 1970 and 1973.

However, as evidenced by last year's close six-team struggle, Long Island is no longer dominating New York State wrestling as was the case in the pre-1970 years.

This weekend, the sections that loom as the pre-tourney co-favorites appear to be defending champion Eleven and the Southern Tier's Section Four, Eleven's potent lineup is headed by the Huntington duo of Mike Picozzi at 105 and returning Intersectional king Jeff Thomas at 112 plus Suffolk tourney "MVP" Mike Siehien of Brentwood Ross at 132 pounds.

Section Four sports possible finalists in precocious 105-pound sophomore (62-1-1) Mark lacovelli of Ithaca plus 126-pound senior Kurt Kaminsky of Binghamton North.

If those two regions falter, look for Sections Three, Five, Six and Eight to again rate as the leading challengers.

The gold-garbed host team is led by Intersectional Meet repeaters George Medina of Baldwinsville at 119 pounds, Bruce Porter of South Jefferson at 167 and defending State 250-pound champion Dan Lang of Baldwinsville at 250.

Section Five boasts last year's "Most Outstanding Wrestler" trophy-winner, Frank DeAngelis of Spencerport at 138 pounds. He has won his last 61 bouts over three seasons and is aiming to capture four more here in the War Memorial. The Rochester team also points to 145-pound Dave Juergens of Hilton and 215-pound Mike Pochalski of Irondequoit as top title threats

Section Six is again anchored by representatives from the defending School champion, Pioneer Central. Coach Dick Post's powerful Pioneer "pinmen" are captained by 155-pound Keith Stearns, who merits'

watching. He has a 34-0 record this season, with an amazing 33 pins! Section Eight's finest are likely to be 119-pound Steve Cavayero of Bellmore Kennedy, 132-pound Eric Wolfson of Calhoun, 138-pound Scott Arnel of Westbury and 215-pound Jackie Robinson of Roosevelt.

All eleven New York State sections are again represented and Central New York wrestling followers bid welcome to all our fellow mat enthusiasts.

Among the competitors this weekend are three defending champions — Huntington's Jeff Thomas, Spencerport's Frank DeAngelis and Baldwinsville's Dan Lang. Thomas triumphed at 98 a year ago but is returning at 112. DeAngelis again occupy the 138 and Lang the 250-pound divisions.

In the team category, impressive win streaks are currently possessed by perennial New York State powers Union-Endicott-4 (59), Baldwins ville-3 (47), Horseheads-4 (33), Pioneer-6 (32), Peru-7 (30) and Schenectady Niskayuna-2 (27). Recently, the lengthy 79-dual meet streak owned by Coach Joe Campo's fine Brentwood Ross-11 team was snapped, 22-18, by Half Hollow Hills in a Suffolk County showdown. All of those teams, with the exception of Horseheads, are sending at least one athlete to Syracuse.

Again this year, no pre-meet seedings have been issued, with pairings being drawn from a hat. This practice is the fairest possible although it does mean, of course, that two or three top wrestlers in a weight class could be placed in the same bracket. For that reason, "wrestlebacks" were introduced into the meet three years ago.

To the outstanding wrestler will go a trophy, awarded jointly by the New York State Sports Writers' Association and the New York State Wrestling Coaches' Association, for the sixth straight year. The previous winners were 215-pound Mike Phillips of Cooperstown-3 in 1970, 145-pound John Cuyler of Elmira Free Academy-4 in 1971, 177-pound Dwight Cartwright of Keshequa-5 in 1972, 177-pound Greg Stevens of Fulton-3 in 1973 and 138-pound Frank DeAngelis of Spencerport-5 last March.

Of that group, Stevens has enjoyed the finest collegiate career. He had compiled a record of 22-6 at 190 pounds as a member of the nation's No. 1 team, Iowa University (17-0-1) as of last weekend.

Today, to all teams and wrestlers, we in Central New York extend our congratulations for having earned a trip to the New York State Intersectional Tournament. Good luck, and we hope that you enjoy your state finals, win or lose.

FRANK DeANGELIS — "MOST OUTSTANDING WRESTLER"

One year ago, 138-pound junior Frank DeAngelis of Spencerport—5 was voted as the "Most Outstanding Wrestler" at the conclusion of the 12th annual New York State Intersectional Tournament here. No junior had ever earned that prestigious award before.

This weekend, 138-pound senior Frank DeAngelis of Spencerport—5 returns to the Onondaga County War Memorial, bringing with him a varsity career record of 98-1 as he shoots for a second straight title.

Two-time State wrestling champions are rare. In fact, only 14 athletes have won Intersectional titles two straight years since the State Tournament originated in 1963, Only one wrestler — 119-pound Dan Hunt of West Genesee—3 last year — has been a three-time State king. Can DeAngelis repeat?

"Frank knows there will be a lot of pressure in Syracuse," observed Spencerport coach Walt Tieke last week. "But he's ready."

Early last month, DeAngelis suffered stretched liagments while competing in the Monroe County Tournament and was sidelined for two matches. But since his return Frank has been working overtime to prepare for another Intersectional crown. Said Tieke: "Last Saturday, when Frank won the Section Five Tournament, he looked better than he has all year."

In Rochester, DeAngelis was voted as the "Most Outstanding Wrestler" last Saturday as he won a third straight Section Five 138-pound title, and moved to within two wins of the century plateau. (Frank's only varsity defeat occurred against Bellmore Kennedy's two-time State champion, Steve Hunte, two years ago in the semifinals of the Intersectional Tournament at Utica. The Score was 16-9.

In Syracuse, standing between DeAngelis and a potential final career record of 102-1 is an outstanding field of rugged 138-pounders from across the state. In his opening Friday bout, Frank will oppose Jeff Nicholson (24-4) of Woodlands—1.

The remainder of the 138-pound Intersectional class consists of:

three-time Section Ten champion Kelly Geary (22-1) of Ogdensbu three-time Section Seven king Bruce Bonville (24-2-1, 66-6-1 career) Peru—7, unbeaten Scott Arnel (26-0) — who was named "Most Or standing" at the Section Eight tourney, two-time Section Nine ki Mike Harris (24-1) of Newburgh Free Academy, unbeaten Mike Kanaugh (30-0) of Voorheesville—2, Joe Ventaloro (25-2-1) of perenn Long Island power Brentwood Ross—11, muscular John Clark (29-3) Sandy Creek—3, Gene Tundo (27-1) of Frontier—6 and Karl Ehntho (26-5-1) of Vestal—4.

If DeAngelis managed to conquer that field, he'll join a list of patwo-time Intersectional kings which includes: John Harris (Hem stead—8) in 1963-64, Ken Melchior (Lindenhurst—11) in 1964-6 Claude Poole (Ithaca—4) in 1965-66, John Sorochinsky (Union-Enc cott—4) in 1965-66, Alan Stock (Mepham—8) in 1966-67, Jim Dax (Mount Vernon—1) in 1966-67, and Randy Payne (Sidney—4) 1968-69.

Rounding out the lineup of previous repeat champs are Lee Klepp (Suffern—9) in 1968-69, John Cuyler (Elmira Free Academy—4) 1970-71, Joe Goldsmith (Ramapo—9) in 1971-72, Bob Antonac (Brentwood—11) in 1971-72, Steve Hunte (Bellmore Kennedy—8) in 1972-73, Tom Capone (Watertown—3) in 1972-73, and Mark Mysny (Vestal—4) in 1973-74.

Besides DeAngelis, two other defending State champs in action her this weekend will be junior Jeff Thomas of Huntington—11 at 11 pounds and senior Dan Lang of Baldwinsville—3 at 250. Thomas captured the New York State 98-pound crown as a sophomore while Lan also won at 250 as a junior a year ago.

MAT NOTES — DeAngelis, as a freshman, was 17-0 on the JV tear and 2-0 with the varsity; as a sophomore 36-1; as a junior 32-0; an 28-0 this year. Frank has won 61 consecutive bouts and his Spencerpor "Rangers" team has lost only one dual meet (by one point) during th last three seasons. Even if DeAngelis gets 101 wins, he will fall short o the state career-wins record of 110, set last year by Mike Arnold o Pioneer—6, Both Dan Hunt and Randy Payne finished with 107 caree victories.
