## Full Cards For Thumb Opening

A spring preview of what lies ahead in the way of Thoroughbred racing at Finger Lakes Race Track for the 13th season starts tomorrow afternoon at 1:30 p.m. A full field of horses has been promised for all nine races by General Manager John O'Keefe who is beginning his third season at the helm of the local track.

Proving that no shortage of horses exists is the fact that over 90 thoroughbreds are entered in the Saturday program.

Many new jockeys as well as horses, owners and trainers are on hand for the opening of the weekend racing season which will continue through April 21. Regular season begins Friday, April 26 when racing will be held five days each week with Tuesdays and Thursdays being dark days.

Only one maiden claiming race is on the nine race card and that's the opening race over 4 1/2 furlongs. Local owner Norma Aronson has two of her thoroughbreds in the opening day's card with Cross Arm the probable favorite in the second race while April Threat will run in the \$1,800 eighth race. This horse set a new track record at Penn National recently and should be a heavy favorite Saturday.

With the gas problem, a very

important one insofar as getting the racing fans to Finger Lakes the management has worked long hours getting the bus lines to run special buses to the track. Empire Trailways will run buses from Buffalo, Batavia and Rochester to the track while Rainbow Tours will have buses leaving Elmira, Corning, Bath, Penn Yan and Hammondsport. Crispell Charter Service will have buses leaving Ithaca and Watkins Glen while the Syracuse-Oswego Bus Lines have buses leaving the main terminal in Syracuse then will stop to pick up patrons at the State Fairgrounds in North Syracuse. Racing fans can leave their autos in a large parking area at the Fairgrounds.

"All in all we have done just about everything we can possible do to help the racing fans get to the track and to get back home again. We also hope to have a bus service out of Auburn before Saturday," publicity director Bob Wade said this morning.

With a new track and a completely new drainage system in operation that cost over \$150,000, track officials are hopeful that a good season of racing can be held without too many problems. A crowd of over 4,000 is expected to be on hand for the opener.
