NIAGARA FALLS — Kirk Anderson was Olean High School's only winner in the Section 6 Class AA wrestling championships that saw powerhouse Niagara-Wheatfield Central dominate the action for the seventh straight year.

Anderson, capturing the 132 pound crown, made his record 26-2 with his four wins in the tournament while two other OHS hopefuls — Allen Jerge in the 98 pound class and Mark Shaw in the 126 pound class — were losers in the title bouts. They, however, move on to the coming weekend's Section 6 inter-class bouts at Sweet Home Central School.

N-W had seven winners, including Bob Sloan who was a fourth place finisher in the state championships last year and a strong contender in the U.S. Olympic trials last summer.

Williamsville South's Mitch Brown lived up to his top rating, decisioning second-seeded Paul Roeser of Wheatfield, 9-4, for the 138-pound crown. He was named outstanding wrestler of the tournament.
