AT PINE VALLEY, Walters' Cattaraugus Central squad was the team winner and last week he predicted "nine in the finals." He came away with three champions, five second places and they'll all be in next weekend's finals. Franklinville's Big three

were impressive victors, also at Pine Valley — Skip Lord making his record 23-0 and all by pins; Joe Smith making his record 22-1 and Dana Linderman making his record 20-1-1.

AT MAPLE GROVE — where Portville finished third — coach Joel Fowler's Joey Swanson emerged as the MVP or, as they put it in wrestling terminology, "Most Outstanding." Besides, Swanson, Portville had three other winners and three others who lost out in the finals.

AT NEWFANE — where Salamanca finished third in the scoring — the Warriors came up with Mike Newark, John Fitzgerald and Sartori as champions and placed three others in the finals. Art Jacobsen, Salamanca's '129 pounder was loser in overtime with an 8:24 pin and the decision sort of spotlighted what many of the coaches and close observers of wrestling, considered "inferior officiating."

In fact, that seemed to be the story at all eight sites. "In a show-piece of wrestling, such as this," noted one coach, "they should have four referees at each site and they should be the very best available."

PIONEER'S three unbeaten stars — Mike Arnold, Keith Stearns and Phil Roblee — each went 26-0 but it was teammate Bill Fuller (24-1-1) who was named the MVP of the meet. Arnold is seeking his third year as a Section 6 representative in the state action and his only losses (three) in the three years were in the state. Stearns and Roblee did not get past the Section 6 finals last year.

Bradford In 'A' Test--

Emporium's Simon Goes For Pa. Title

CLARION, Pa. — Mike Simon and Scott Mullens — Emporium High School's unbeaten stars — with Kane's Pat Imbrogno and four Ridgway stars are among the favorites to capture Class B titles in District 9 (Pa.) wrestling championship at Clarion State College next Friday-Saturday.

Fifteen schools are entered in the Class B division and in the Class A division Bradford High is one of six schools. The 'B' action starts at 1 p.m. Friday, the 'A' joins the 'B' wrestling at 6:30 p.m. Saturday's action starts at 1 p.m. with the consolations at 6:15 p.m., and the title matches in both divisions are at 7:30 p.m.

THE TOP two finishers in each division advance to Pennsylvania regionals — 'B' still at Clarion and the 'A' at St. Marys College in the Pittsburgh area. Besides Bradford, other 'A' schools are Clearfield, St. Marys Public, Bedford, DuBois and Punxsutawney. Bedford has six top seeds, Clearfield with five.

In the 'A' seedings (Sunday),

Bradford picked up a second in 141 pounder Kevin Newton (14-1 record); two third places in 148 Craig Campbell (11-3-1) and 158 pounder Bob Cosco (6-2-1); and three fourth places in 115 pounder Al Bean (8-5), 122 pounder John Morehouse (7-6-1) and 170 pounder Wendell Steinhauer (14-2).
