ER's mid-season victories taught wrestlers 'we're better than we thought'

Blame it on the athletic director.

That was what East Rochester Coach Don Quinn was preparing to do midway through this high school wrestling season.

His team had lost two meets in three days and vacated the No. 1 spot in the Democrat and Chronicle Section 5 coaches poll for the first time in 21/2 years.

Trouble at the home of the champions. Quinn was "ready to go to a basketball game somewhere."

"We had Webster coming up," he recalled yesterday, "and the athletic director had done a nice job of scheduling Le Roy and Canandaigua on the same

Quinn is East Rochester's AD. He also is the coach responsible for building one of this state's best wrestling programs. Indeed, one of the best this side of the Mississippi.

ER responded to its tough schedule in true Bombers' fashion, however. They defeated Webster (32-18), Le Roy (36-15) and Canandaigua (28-22) and went on to finish their dual-meet schedule with a 12-2 record.

"That was the turning point of our season," said Quinn, whose 27-year record at ER (318-45-7) is third-best in the nation.

"The kids and I both stopped and said, 'Hey, we're better than we thought.'"

ER went on to win its ninth consecutive Section 5 championship Saturday when it easily outdistanced 21 other Class B teams at Geneva.

The Bombers also earned the title of wrestling Team of the Year for the third consecutive season by finishing as a

unanimous No. 1 pick in the Democrat

and Chronicle's final poll.

"I'm a believer that until you get beat you're the best," said Quinn, "but I really didn't think we'd be the Team of the Year at the beginning of the year. We lost seven good seniors last year (to graduation). I didn't know if we had the leadership coming back."

However, seniors Chris Schojan and Frank Rossi provided the necessary lead-

ership, Quinn said.

"And," he added, "some of the young

kids that filled in did a great job.

"Steve Marcoccia came in from junior high wrestling to the varsity," he said. "He wasn't even seeded in this (sectional) tournament and he made the finals."

Marcoccia was defeated in the 98pound title bout by Penn Yan's Bruce Lafler, 7-1. He was one of six individuals to reach the finals for ER, which outscored runner-up and eighth-ranked Le Roy, 184½-124. Palmyra-Macedon was third with 117 points.

Schojan (177 pounds) and junior Mike Condello (132) won titles. It was Schojan's third straight sectional crown. A two-time state runner-up, he is 30-0 on the season and 129-10 as a varsity competitor. He is the school's all-time winningest wrestler.

In all, nine Bombers will advance to the Super Sectionals, the Rochester area's state qualifying meet Saturday at Brockport State.

Canandaigua, the area's second-ranked team, will send eight to that qualifier. Three Braves — Mike Lacognato (98), Paul Lamphier (112) and Butch Hibbard (119) — won individual championships as the team easily claimed the Class A title Saturday at Monroe Community College.

It was Canandaigua's 10th sectional

championship in 11 years.

"We got a lot of help from a lot of people," said Coach Larry Reynolds, who had 12 of 13 individuals score points for his team.

Reynolds called it his team's best per-

formance of the season.

But Spencerport Coach Bill Jacoutot said, "That is the best I've seen Canandaigua wrestle in my four years."

Canandaigua finished 44½ points ahead of third-ranked Brockport and 19 other teams. Included in the long list of runners-up were fourth-ranked Spencerport in third place, No. 5 Brighton in fourth, No. 6 Webster in fifth, No. 7 McQuaid in sixth, and No. 9 Hilton in seventh.

Marion, which shares the No. 10 spot with Palmyra-Macedon, was the Class C champion. The Knights did not win their third title by a huge margin, however.

Jeff Marchionda (126), Jim Newby (145) and Tim Habecker (155) claimed individual titles as Marion edged Wil-

liamson, 159-154. Habecker, the son of 19th-year Coach Steve Habecker, is 32-0 on the year. It was his first sectional crown.

"It was the best sectional win for me because my son is involved," said Steve, who coached Marion to team titles in 1977 and '78.

"Williamson was stronger all the way through," he said. "They had a more solid team. I thought they had the power to take it."

Perry's Emery Uveino helped Marion clinch the title with a 5-0 overtime decision over Williamson's Jody Pieters at 167 pounds.

"To me," Coach Habecker said, "that match went on for about an hour."

Bolivar enjoyed its finest hour in the history of that school's wrestling program Saturday night at Geneseo. The Bulldogs won their first sectional championship over 19 other Class D teams.

"I told them at the beginning of the year, I thought we had a good chance at taking it," said sixth-year Coach Mike DeBarbieri. "This is the best team I've ever had."

Brad Schiralli (112) and Larry Smith (167) won individual titles and six wrestlers, in all, earned a trip to the state qualifier.

Bolivar got off to a fast start Friday night when nine of its 11 competitors won first-round bouts with pins.
