Jones Repeats As Section 5, 137-Pound Top Grappler

ROCHESTER — The Monroe County wrestlers dominated the Section 5 Class A finals Saturday at Monroe Community College taking seven crowns. The Finger Lakes grapplers got three and the Southern Tier one champion.

Don Jones of the Braves repeated his championship of last year with three wins, all by pins, and the last a Frank Merriwell finish. He is the 137-pound champ.

Jerry Case of CA last year's 95-pound king, had to settle for second place, losing in the finals.

Also getting wins from the Finger Lakes were Jim Welsh of Geneva who becomes the new 95-pound champion and Greg Amidon of Mynderse Academy of Seneca Falls, who won the 145-pound title.

Overall Champs

Spencerport copped the coveted team trophy and also four first place crowns. Also getting championship were: Greece Arcadia, Penfield Irondequoit, East Rochester and Corning West.

In winning his second Section 5 crown, Jones did a tremendous job. He pinned Tyrone Crumity of West High in 2:20 in the opener. Then he pinned Stan Young of Bath in 1:47 in the semi-final.

The final match had Coach Weldon Canough and the rest of the Ca rooters in "ulcer gulch." Tom Gartland of Spencerport was leading Jones, 8-4, with one minute left in the match. Jones, on the bottom, reversed Gartland and went into a pinning combination flattening the Spencerporter at 5:08. His remark, "I don't know what everyone was worrying for, I wasn't."

Jerry Case of CA went up against a tartar in Chuck Grossman of Greece - Arcadia in the finals.

Thrilling Contest

Case beat John Charland of Edison, 7-0, in the quarter-final. He then wrestled Al Solomon who had beaten him, 4-2, in the dual meet with Rush - Henrietta earlier in the season. The regular match ended in a 4-4 draw. The overtime also ended in a 2-2 draw with Case having a reversal and Solomon two escapes. Case got a well deserved judges' decision to send him into the finals against Grossman.

Grossman, who was undefeated this year was a little too much for Case and decisioned him, 5-2 for the title.

Ca's other two entries, Bob Connelly and Jim Hartwell, both lost opening round matches to the County champions and then dropped consolation round matches.

Jim Welsh of Geneva won his championship with a 2-1 win over Dave Travis of Spencerport winning on riding time. Dave VanNostrand of Waterloo finished fifth.

Mynderse Winner

Alan Calabro of Mynderse finished third at 115 pounds losing to Brien O'Lena in the semi-finals on a mix-up at the scorers table and then beat John LaBoy of Edison for third place.

Farrell Simmons of Penn Yan lost in the semi-finals to Dan Ranieri of Rush-Henrietta and finished fourth.

Jim Sinicropi of Mynderse lost to Tom Lacognina in the opener and to Rick Lau in the consolation round.

Dave Atkinson of Geneva finished fifth in the 137-pound class.

In winning the 145-pound crown, Greg Amidon of Mynderse beat Dan Lee of Monroe 4-2 in the opener. Dean Hoag of Bath in the semi-final round and Martin Cangiolosi, Jefferson, in the finals 5-3.

5th Place Winner

Teri Manslank of Geneva lost to Bob Huizenga of Penfield in the opener and won his consolation round against Andy Baker of West. He finished sixth when he lost to Mark Gillispie of Bath.

Stu Smith of Mynderse lost in the finals to Kurt Blank of Irondequoit 7-0. Smith beat Wil Meys of Jefferson 9-1, Kevin Norris of Corning West 5-1 but was no match for Blank in the finals.

Dick Atkinson of Phelps-Clifton Springs lost to Tim Guy of East Rochester and to Tony Marciano in the consolation round.

Paul Manslank of Geneva lost to Frank Beswick of Spencerport 5-3 in the finals finishing second. Manslank had wins over John Boccardo of East 9-1 and Gary Siconolfi of Eastridge 4-1 in the semifinals. Beswick had a penalty point and a takedown in the last period for the win.

Steve Horrigan and Charlie Catalano finished third and fourth in the heavyweight division with Catalano beating Horrigan for the third spot. Horrigan beat Catalano for the Finger Lakes crown.
