Two titles for Irondequoit

Barker, Cavanaugh win; Brighton top team but no champions

Irondequoit wrestlers Shawn Cavanaugh and Bill Barker sat down before the season to map out their plans.

"Our highest goal was to win states," Barker said yesterday afternoon. "And there were the other things, too ... go undefeated, win the county tournament, make all-county. Thing like that."

Cavanaugh, however, attatched his goal of winning the state meet to an asterisk.

A 177-pound asterisk.

"Shawn wrote down that he wanted to be the fifth state champion from Irondequoit," Barker said, "but we've only had three."

It looks as though Barker will have to

be No. 4. And the Indians' 177-pound wrestler is holding up his end just as well as the 215-pound Cavanaugh.

Both won Section 5 Class A individual championships last night at Rush-Henrietta Sperry.

Brighton defended its team championship, scoring 1811/2 points and rallying from a 51/2-point deficit entering the final round by doing well in the consolation matches. Spencerport (180), McQuaid (142), Brockport (128) and Gates-Chili (114) followed.

No Brighton wrestlers won individual championships.

Spencerport's duo of Ray LeChase (119 pounds) and Tom Billone (126) continued to win, with each defending his Section 5 championship.

Like, Barker and Cavanaugh, they form a back-to-back terror. Another twosome, senior twins Chris and Doug Miller of Pittsford, didn't fare as well. They lost decisions in the 145- and 155-pound finals, respectively.

The ability to train with a teammate of equally high ability has been an advantage to the above duos all season.

"It means everything," LeChase said. "It's someone to drill with, someone to help you lose weight and someone to

push you when you're down.

It's also someone to train with in preparation for the supersectionals.

The Spencerport wrestlers, as well as Irondequoit's pair of 32-0 seniors, will join the top four finishers in each of four sectional classes next week in the state qualifier at Brockport State.

The state meet will be held March 6-7 at Syracuse. Only one individual in each

class can represent Section 5.

Cavanaugh already is far ahead of where he was last year at this time. He ended the 1986 sectional final flat on his back, the victim of Bishop Kearney wrestler Mike Fusilli's pin. A week later, Fusilli (now at Ithaca College) pinned him

again.

"I knew Mike was going to beat me," Cavanaugh admitted.

Now it's Cavanaugh's opponents who recognize they're in trouble.

"I haven't had anybody duck me," Cavanaugh said after the semifinals, "but I can tell when they're leery. Last year, when I wrestled Mike, I felt the same way. When it's you in the spotlight, you're just like anyone else."

And people have a way of applying pressure when you do reach

the spotlight.

"I can feel people expecting me to win," said Barker, who's had three full years of varsity wrestling and two of football. "I'll be looking at my (results) chart and I'll listen to people talking about me."

They have to be saying nice things about a kid who was 22-12 last year.

Darlean

Barker gives part of the credit to the coaches, especially recent addition Alex Macaluso, who works with the heavyweights each day.

But, there's also another reason

for the success.

Said Barker: "I know a kid

might be good, but he's not working out with a Shawn Cavanaugh every day."

Like the two Irondequoit wres-

tlers, Andy Antonucci of Hilton (now 32-1) entered the final undefeated. Coaches rave about the youngster's aggressiveness on the mats, but his unrelenting approach may have been his downfall last night.

Unlike Cavanaugh and Barker,

the 91-pounder also entered the tournament knowing he'd have two more shots at winning a sectional championship if he lost the final to Edison's Andy Aceto.

That didn't influence him a bit.

"I've wrestled some good wres-

tlers this year, but deep down I've always expected to win," Antonucci said.

The sophomore could well have

expected to win last night, but he was reversed and pinned in a stunning turnaround after Aceto had fallen behind midway through the second period by a 6-2 score.

Antonucci already owned a 6-1

dual-meet victory over Aceto.

"It's a little easier to deal with the pressure when you know that he knows you've beaten him once already this season," Antonucci said. "You've got that edge on him."

But the edge is gone now as he prepares for next weekend's supersectionals. He, like dozens of other

near-winners, has a week to get it back.




