WRESTLING WRAP-UP

The Section 5 New York State Wrestling Tournament has already commenced this past weekend. We will review the matchups and be primarily concerned with both Class C and Class D. Many of the top ranked and rated teams in the area are from right in our own back yard. Unfortunately we will not be able to relay the results of Saturday's first round due to the time and date which the competition took place; however we will look at the placement of the first round of competition.

Defending-Champions the Le Roy Oatkan Knights have the lead going into the Section 5 Class C Wrestling Championships at the Geneseo High School.

Le Roy wrapped up the regular season with a record of 14-3-0 with 16 percentage points going into sectional matches. That record was good enough to bring the Knights up a spot, to be ranked 9th in the final regular season Section 5 Wrestling Poll.

Le Roy has eight wrestlers who have advanced to the semifinal round of competition. Knight representatives included in these ranks are Dan Shirley, the 105pound class, Jay Beaumont of the 126 pound class, Andy Woodruff of the 132pound class, Todd Englerth of the 138pound class, Jeff Koch of the 145pds class, Mike Chester of the 177pound class, Shawn Matthews of the 215pound class, and Joe Miller at the 250 pound class.

Le Roy has 55½ sectional points, making them the top-seed for Class C. Nine quality points back of Le Roy is Sodus in second place and in third is Addison with 45½ points; just ½ point ahead of fourth seeded Perry, the YellowJackets have 45 points.

Other local teams are also highly seeded going into the tourney. The Warsaw Tigers who had a very solid seasonal performance, especially on their own home mats, are seeded sixth in the 19-team field with 34½ points. The Byron-Bergen Bees buzz in at the 7th position with 32 points, the Indians of Letchworth are also part of the top ten with 27½ quality points. Alexander is 24th at 24 points, Pembroke follows with 21 points in the 13th spot and Holley is 16th with 12 points.

Other area wrestlers in the semifinals will be: Tim Herman of Byron-Bergen [91pds], Dan O'Grady of Byron-Bergen [98pds], Shannon Davies of Warsaw [112pds], Matt Todaro of Warsaw [112pds], Andy Woodruff of Byron-Bergen [119pds], Willie Miller of Perry [119pds], Brad Collings of Perry [126pds], Geoff Smith of Alexander [126pds], and Dave Royce of Warsaw [132pds].

Also competing at Geneseo will be representatives from local high schools like Eric Toal of Byron-Bergen [138pds], Brian Spicer of Alexander [138pds], George West of Perry [138pds], Rob Norman of Holley [145pds], Scott DeGroff of Perry [155pds], Bill Miller of Letchworth [155pds], Rob Goodell of Perry [167pds], Mike Uveino of Letchworth [167pds], Carl Schroeder of Pembroke [177pds], and Dave Lichtenthal of Pembroke [250pds].

Over in Class D for small schools in Section 5 Championship action, Pavilion has the edge but not the top-seed as they venture into the Geneseo State College gymnasium.

Pavilion is an honor mention club on the Section 5 Wrestling Poll with a perfect seasonal scoreboard of 14-0. But the team will go into the Sectional Tourney seeded third in Class D out of 17 teams participating in the event.

Alfred-Almond leads after the regular season with the top seed but its a four-way battle. "A-A" has 55points, second seed Canisteo has 52points and Pavilion has 50. Avoca is bringing up the rear

in fourth with 46points. Other Geneseo Region representatives are Kendall and Lyndonville ranked 7th and 8th respectively.

Pavilion has seven grapplers going in the semifinal round headed by Dan Hinrich at 91pounds, Chad Draper at 98 pounds, Arturo Martinez at 112 pounds, John Bannister at 126pounds, Tim Sullivan 138pounds, George Brown at 145pds. and Brent Walton at 155pounds.

WARSAW 35, PERRY 19...Warsaw pins were by Mark Onisk (98, 1:12), Matt Todaro (112, 4:17), and Dave Bischananey at 215 pounds. Dave Royce (132pds) notched a 21-9 decision to raise his record in dual matches to 10-0-1. Scott DeGroff (155pds) had the only pin for Perry.... Caledonia-Mumford defeated Honeoye Falls-Lima, 39-24...Le Roy defeated Dansville, 55-5...GENESEO 33, YORK 29...The Blue Devils were led by Jason Barber (126, 1:38), Craig Chiara (138, 1:45), Lea Weber (155, 1:28), and Keith Peri (215, :31) all had pins. Peri's pin clinched the Geneseo victory.....Pembroke downed Alexander 38-29...Le Roy stopped Geneseo 45-12...Livonia pinned Perry 35-23, ...DANSVILLE 36, WARSAW 30...The Mustangs won by scoring a pin at the 177pds. class to deadlock the score at 30-apiece, but the Tigers had to forfeit the heavy-weight match and so the final margin of victory. Matt Todaro (112pds), Taber Smith (119), Mike Grover (126), and Dave Royce (132) all had pins for the Tigers.
