

Rochester's Webster High School, a new face hereabouts, dethroned defending kingpin Binghamton North in the fourth annual Groton Holiday Wrestling Tournament conducted last Friday and Saturday. Webster took six titles, runnerup North notching four.

No team scores were reported. Sixteen schools took part.

Host Groton Central settled for John Toolan's consolation victory at 114-pounds where a Webster entry won the school's first blue ribbon. It; went on to take 128-147-157-169-179. It added a second and two thirds.

Webster is one of Section 5's oncoming strengths, another Canandaiqua which last Friday won the nine-school North Syracuse Tournament in which Cortland High was fourth on second palce windups by 98 Bob Sams, 138 John Butler, 145 Gary Huntley, 155 Garry Stone.

At Groton, 134 pound Marvin Amos of Copenhagen in the north country won the Most Valuable Wrestling award.
