## SEEDING PROCEDURE

The seeding for the class tournaments will be done by the seeding committee, appointed by the coordinator. Each class committee will have a maximum of 7 members, with a representative from each league.

Wrestlers will be seeded to at least 8 places. More places will be seeded if the committee deems it necessary. Other places will be drawn.

A point system will be used to place the wrestlers initially.

2 points for a win

1 point for a draw

-1 point for a loss

For Section V dual meets only

Minimum of 8 matches to be considered for seeding

Non-Section V Matches can be used to reach the minimum

After the initial placing, wrestlers can be moved when the committee considers the following:

Past Section V place finishes

Level of competition

Winning percentage

Tournament competition

Head to head competition

Any changes at tournament time will be made by the chairman and members of the seeding committee.

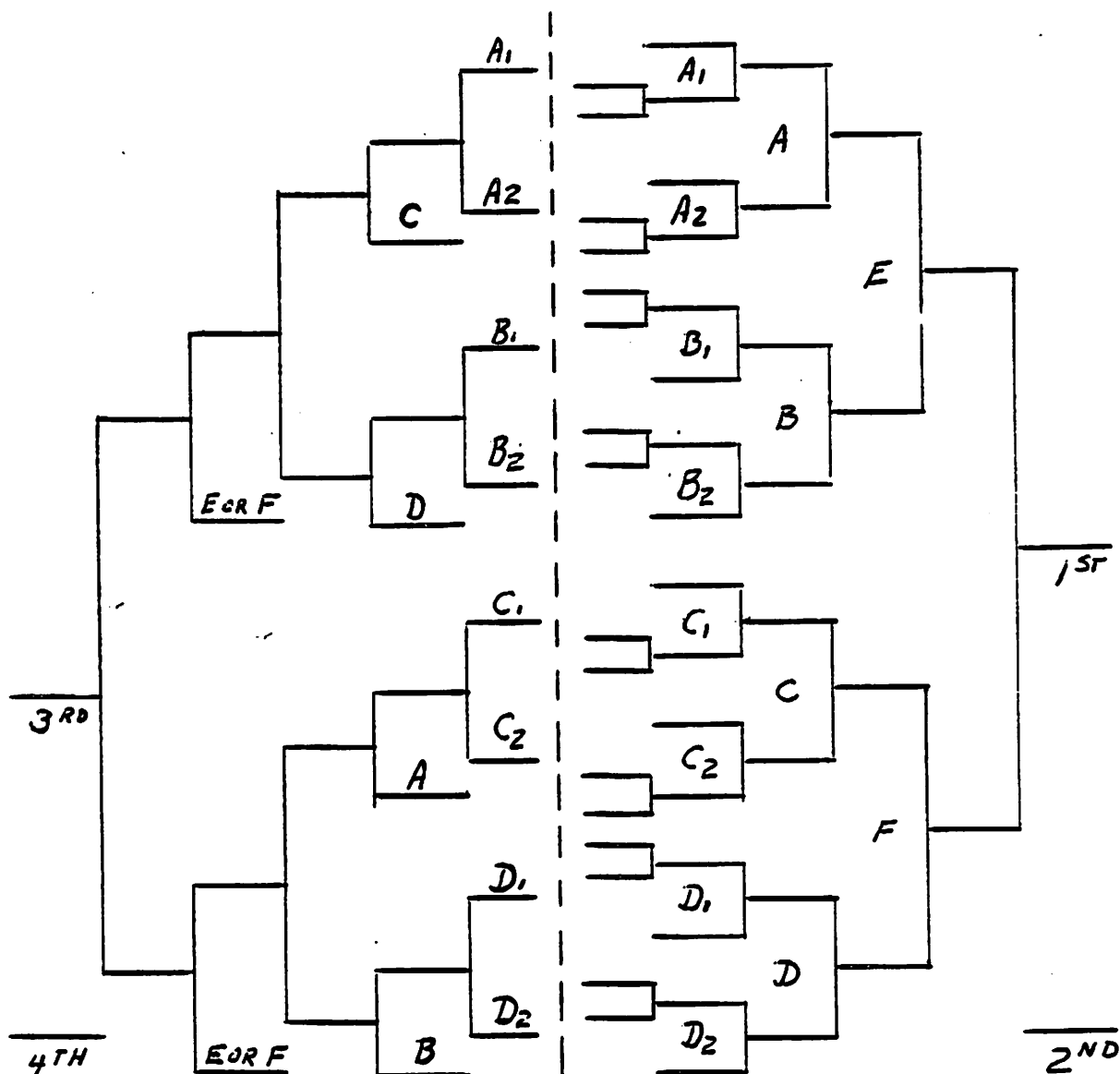

**APPEALS PROCEDURE FOR SECTIONAL WRESTLING TOURNAMENTS**  
(Effective 1987-1988 Wrestling Season)

**1. FOR "SUPER SECTIONAL" (Final Sectional Qualifier for State Tourn.)**

- a. The Appeals Committee shall be the WOA of Section 5 Official Rules Interpretation Committee (The Official Interpreter and those members of the WOA Executive Committee who attended the most recent State Interpretation meeting held in Oct. prior to start of the season.) This should be a 3 person committee. Otherwise, the WOA President, who is also the official interpreter, shall appoint other officials to fill the vacant position(s). This shall be done prior to the tournament.
- b. If any of the Executive Committee members who are members of the Interpretation Committee are unable to attend the Super Sectional or if any of the Interpretation Committee should have a "conflict of interest" in the match being appealed (e.g. being the official or assistant, school from same town, etc.), there shall be a previously established rank order of substitutes to fill any vacancies. This shall be done following the same procedure followed in "a" above.

**2. FOR CLASS SECTIONALS**

The Section 5 Chairman and the WOA President (who is also the official interpreter) shall cooperate in the selection of a Head Official for each class tournament. They will then designate officials in rank order to serve on the Appeals Committee with the Head Official. The committee shall number 3 persons. The Official Interpreter, when present, shall always be one of the members.

**3. WHAT QUALIFIES FOR APPEAL AND WHAT PROCEDURES ARE FOLLOWED**

- a. The procedure is intended only for Sectional Tournaments. It will be used in some tournaments on an experimental basis prior to the Sectionals, but only if the tournament has enough officials assigned so that the procedure can be implemented as stated above.
- b. Items involving tournament organization, etc. fall under the jurisdiction of the tournament chairman and not the appeals committee.
- c. The ONLY appeals that will be heard and ruled on by the Appeals Committee must involve a misapplication of a rule or a rule interpretation. As usual, calls involving judgement cannot be questioned, nor can they be appealed.
- d. The coach must first follow the procedures in the Rule Book (Rule 6-6-6). The coach must immediately tell the mat official that he wants to appeal the referee's application of the rule or interpretation.
  - 1) If the match has ended, only the offended wrestler must remain on the mat, but the mat official shall instruct the other wrestler to remain in the mat area.

2) The Appeals Committee shall be summoned. The coach has 2 minutes to state his case, but the Committee may want to question him additionally. Video tape will not be submitted as evidence, nor shall the appeals committee review any tape prior to making a decision. The referee and assistant, if being used, shall explain the call and the rationale for it.

3) The Appeals Committee shall meet alone where they can be free from any interference and once they present their decision, it is final.

- a) If a rule or interpretation has been misapplied, any penalties levied against the coach because of his protest, shall be removed. The situation shall be corrected and bad time wrestled, if necessary.
- b) If the Appeals Committee rules that it is judgement being questioned, the coach shall be penalized according to the rule book only if he has not already been penalized during the match for questioning the same judgement call.
- c) If the Appeals Committee rules that the referee's decision was correct, there shall be no further penalty against the coach because of the appeal. However, the coach may be penalized for any unsportsmanlike actions after the decision has been rendered.

Growth Allowance: New York State will continue to use as in the past.

2 lbs. added as of January 1st.

1 lb. added as of February 1st.

1 lb. added as of March 1st.

Coin Toss: New York State will use the coin toss this season to determine the team that puts their wrestler on the mat first and also has the choice at the start of the second period.

Important Reminders:

- 1) Weight Lists should be sent to your league chairman before your first competition. A copy of this list should also be sent to each of your opponents.
- 2) Re-certification is not intended for the whole team.
- 3) Entries for the class tournaments Have to be in on time. We will not accept entries by telephone. The entry forms will be mailed later along with evaluation forms for officials.
- 4) Coaches are responsible for knowing the rules. eligibility requirements. sports standards. etc.
- 5) Coaches are responsible for the conduct of their wrestlers. assistant coaches. spectators. and any others associated with the team.

### Guidelines for Weigh-Ins

- 1) The wrestler from the visiting team will take the scale first, followed by the wrestler from the home team.
- 2) The entire weigh-in period for dual meets shall be 1/2 hour beginning from the time the first wrestler steps on the scale. (This time should be established as per the Federation Rule Book.)
- 3) The scale shall be available to the visiting team at least 1/2 hour prior to actual weigh-ins so that visiting wrestlers may check their weight.
- 4) If a wrestler is not prepared to make weight at his normal place in the shoulder-to-shoulder line up, he may still have until the end of the 1/2 hour weigh-in period to make weight. He must, however, be ready to step on the scale prior to the close of the weigh-in period. (No additional time will be granted for stripping down, towelling off, etc.)

NYSPPHSAA WRESTLING COMMITTEE  
Guidelines for the use of the Honor Weigh-In System  
For Dual Meets

1. Each wrestler shall make scratch weight at the weigh-in conducted at the home school.

2. Each wrestler who has made scratch weight at his home school will be permitted an allowance of 3 pounds at the matside weigh-in.

3. A wrestler who has not made scratch weight at the early weigh-in will not be permitted the 3 pounds allowance and must make scratch weight at the matside weigh-in in order to compete.

4. All weights will be recorded and certified by the Principal or Athletic Director or a person of authority designated by the Principal or Athletic Director. The list of certified weights shall be submitted at the official weigh-in before the meet.

5. Weigh-ins at the home school may be conducted upon the wrestler's arrival at school in the morning. Individual schools may set a time limit for the completion of the honor weigh-ins.

6. The honor weigh-in is the OFFICIAL WEIGH-IN. The weigh-in at the home school determines the weight class in which the wrestler may compete, e.g. if a wrestler weighs in and qualifies for the 119 lb. class, he can legally wrestle at 119 lbs and 126lbs. NOTE: A contestant shall not wrestle more than one weight class above that class for which his actual stripped weight, at the time of weigh-in qualifies him (Rule 4-4-5).

If the wrestler exceeds the 3 lb weight allowance at the actual matside weigh-in, he would become ineligible to wrestle at 119 lbs but would be eligible to wrestle at 126 lbs but NO HIGHER, based on the weight class he became eligible at with the honor weigh-in at his home school.

In the event a wrestler who qualified at a weight class exceeds the 3 lb weight allowance at the matside weigh-in, he would have the opportunity to make weight during the time period allotted per matside weigh-in rules.

If he exceeds the 3 lb allowance for the 126 lb class, and cannot make weight as noted in the paragraph above, he cannot wrestle.

7. The honor weigh-in system will be in effect for all dual meets. Dual meets conducted on non-school days have the option of using the regular matside weigh-in procedure as outlined in the National Federation Rules. Non-school days can be Saturdays or holidays. In the event two schools are scheduled for dual meet, where one school is in session and the other school is not in session, a matside weigh-in may be conducted by either school.

8. Schools that schedule dual meets with out-of-state teams would be obligated to use the regular matside weigh-in procedure as outlined in the National Federation Rules, unless both coaches mutually agreed to use the honor weigh-in system.

## SECTION V WRESTLING

## OFFICIAL WEIGH-IN SHEET

Make copies of this sheet and use it for all weigh-ins.  
A copy of this sheet has to be presented to the scorer's table before a match begins.

HONOR WEIGH-IN (HWI) - Wrestlers are to weigh-in after the start of start of school and before 12:00 noon. The actual weight must be recorded. On Saturday weigh-ins can be between 8:00 and 12:00 noon. The HWI determines the 2 weight classes that a wrestler is eligible for that day.

3 LB. CHECK (3 LB. ✓) - Wrestlers who made the HWI and the 3 lb. check should be simply checked-off. Actual weight does not get recorded.

MATSIDE WEIGH-IN (MWI) - This is a scratch weigh-in for wrestlers who did not honor weigh-in. Actual weight must be recorded, and this weigh-in should be concluded 30 minutes before the scheduled starting time of the dual meet.

IMPORTANT NOTE: A wrestler who does not make the 3 lb. check can only wrestle in the higher class provided he makes the 3 lb. check for that weight class.
