

Meningitis on Long Island


Technique Tapes

Wrestlers today have a great advantage over guys from my day because of video tape. I was only videotaped twice - once in high school and once in college. Both times I got my ass kicked and was too embarrassed to later learn from the tapes. Athletes today have lots of their matches on tape.

Technique tapes also help. I just got sample copies of Sinor Sports Videos' series of three tapes. All three are taught by Joe DeMeo, SUNY Albany and ATWA coach. They are comprehensive, professionally-done, entertaining productions. Great stuff - not just a lot of technique, but lots of strategy, personal anecdotes, and variety. There's also great new service that allows you to have two of your videotaped matches critiqued by DeMeo and Jim Humphrey (1988 Olympic freestyle coach). If I get other samples technique tapes, I'll review those as well.

Stanbro off to Great Start

JJ Stanbro opened his collegiate season impressively, beating three tough opponents. First was a 7-5 win over Ray Miller, Arizona State's 158 pounder. Miller was ranked fourth in the nation by Amateur Wrestling News. Afterwards, JJ beat the Bucknell



wrestler, 13-5, before edging Cornell's rugged Mike New, 8-7.

Effner an All American

Did you know that Jack Effner, third-year head coach at Army, was a two-time NCAA Division I All American? He went 131-20 for Indiana State, captured freshman All American honors and then placed 6th and 5th in the nationals at 142 pounds in 1985 and 1986.

Broome CC Still Fighting

Last season was a tough one for Broome Community College, in Binghamton. Despite its location in the middle of a wrestling hotbed, the team dwindled to just two members by last season's end due to attrition. But it survived, and this year the roster is up to nine wrestlers in seven weight classes. Led by Eric Roscoe, Jim Kohlbach, and Eric Rifanburg, they should have placefinishers in lots of tournaments. First year coach Walt Kuhlman says, "I have total confidence in their ability. Now we need to work on improving and on seeking future athletes." Good luck!

Roselli, Payne Win Cal Open

Lou Roselli, now a senior at Edinboro University, but competing unattached, walked through the December 8th California, PA Red "C" Open. Competing in a crowded, mostly Division I and II tournament, he won by tech fall in 4:25, by default, pin in 3:02, and 9-3 in the finals. Roselli will be redshirting this year. When he comes back next year, he could be the next NCAA champ!

Dan Payne, sophomore at Clarion University, stole the show at 177 pounds. He posted four impressive victories, technical fall in 4:02, 13-9, fall in 1:20, and 10-6 in the finals. Payne is originally from Victor-5 High School.Competing at 150 pounds, Ken Porter went 4-2 in taking fourth.

Sheldon Wins Haparanda Cup in Greco

I wish I had a buck for every medal won by those Greco guys up in Albany. A group of Olympic hopefuls recently toured overseas to gain international experience. Shawn Sheldon, 114.5 pounds, Albany, NY, was the US's only gold medal winner at the Haparanda Cup in Sweden on December 6-8. He won four matches, including a disqualification win in the finals in 4:43.

Said National Greco Coach Mike Houck, "Sheldon proved once again that he is our most consistent winner against top World class competition. He went 4-1 against Soviets. He consistently beats the best wrestlers in the world."

Chris Tironi of Mechanicsville (220) earned a bronze and Isaac Ramaswamy of Albany took fourth at 105.5. Ike Anderson, 149.5; Joe Sabol, 163; and Dave Koplovitz, 286 also competed.

On December 14-15, at the Vaanta Cup in Finland, several New Yorkers placed. Sheldon took third at 114.5 pounds. His only loss was a 3-2 decision to the Russian whom he beat the week before. Ike Anderson took fourth at 136.5 pounds, with Chris Tironi, Isaac Ramaswamy, and Dave Koplovitz all placing fifth. Mike Houck and Joe DeMeo coached.

A month earlier, the US Greco team placed second in the Trope Milone Tournament in Faenza, Italy. Andy Seras, Schenectady, 149.5 took first place, Frank Famiano took fourth at 125.5 pounds, and Ike Anderson, and Shawn Sheldon took fifth place.



Also, copies will be on the tables at the state tournament on Saturday, March 7th. In addition, I'll be sending them out to various people in your section, so they should be popping up all over the place.

If you don't get one by the state tournament, call me at (716) 334-6454. Leave a message with your address, and I'll mail you one. But no stalling! If I don't receive your nomination form by March 12th, you will probably be left out of The New York 100 this year. I really do want to include you if you've got at least 50 career varsity wins, so get going! And pass the word around!!!



State's Top Teams, Longwood and Fulton Battle at Cicero-NS


On Saturday afternoon in a stuffy little gym just north of Syracuse, the state's number one ranking was determined in a most unusual way. Somehow, Cicero-North Syracuse-3 coach Derek Bigford had managed to attract both Fulton-3 and Longwood-11 to his

annual Bill Anderson Memorial Tournament. Bigford, a Division III All American himself, is one of the hardestworking coaches in the state; perhaps that's how he managed to get these two powerhouses under one roof that day.

In last year's final state team poll, coordinated by Neil Kerr, Syracuse Post-Standard, Fulton and Longwood place in the tourney and in the state rankings.

The Most Outstanding Wrestler award was given to Longwood senior Kerry McCoy, 177 pounds. He scored four easy falls on the way to first place. McCoy took second in last year's state tournagreat, from Longwood, Fulton, and other schools.

shared the number one position. And instead of Long Islanders and Central New Yorkers bickering about the top spot all year, it was determined very early.

At the tournament, Fulton, led by coach Mike Connors, finished with five champions and 251 big points - good for the title any other time. But here they got only second place. Somehow Longwood, coached by Mike Picozzi, piled up an amazing 272 points for first ment, losing in the finals seconds, 3-2. Over the summer, he competed extensively and added lots of experience. He is now a solid favorite to win the states at 177.

Longwood and Fulton met headto-head 10 times, with a 5-5 split. Longwood had four champs to Fulton's five, but it was their depth that made the schlep from LI to Syracuse worth it. Jason Klein of Baldwinsville won the most pins award. Lots of other guys looked

Croog Outstanding at Tri-Valley; Many Top 10 Wrestlers Compete

In a talent-packed tournament, Alex Croog, Brighton-5 senior came away with the 119-pound title and MOW award at the 21st annual Tri-Valley Wrestling Tournnament, held at Canastota High School on December 13-14th. Lowville-3 held on to a comfortable lead in taking first place, piling up 200 points to Canastota-3's 178.

Croog was fourth in the states three years ago, then Section 5 runner-up the next year. Last year, he placed second in the NY State championships at 105 pounds. This year, he is currently undefeated and top ranked in the state. At this tourney, he won by 3:15 pin, 18-3 tech fall, 12-2, and 4-2 in the finals over TO Oliver of VVS-3.

This year's Tri-Valley featured lots of great action and several top-ranked wrestlers. It's likely that at least one or two state champs will emerge from this difficult event, and nearly every weight had either a Top Ten Wrestler or someone real close.

In addition to Croog, New Hartford-3 sophomore Terry Showalter ripped up the field on the way to first place at 126 pounds, winning by tech fall, injury default, and 2:51 pin. At heavyweight, Jamie Huntington, Whitehall-2, so impressed tourney scorekeepers that someone penciled in "State Champ??" on one of the bracket sheets. He won in his usual fashion - three quick falls, :22, 1:23, and 1:55 - against some very tough competition.

The big surprise of the meet came at 105 pounds. State champ David Hardwick of Valley Central-9 advanced to the finals easily (7-0 and 16-3), but was beaten in a great 3-2 match by Jim Burns of Essex Junction, Vermont. Burns looked sharp in making the finals, winning by 9-3, 7-1, and 9-3.

Others you may see in Syracuse in March include 91 pound Ben New of Canastota-3; Mark Yanagihara, Balston Spa-2 (he's already been to Syracuse!); Jason Southworth, Vernon-Verona-Sherrill-3 (beat state placewinner John Tyler of Canastota-3); Andy Klein, Canastota-3, Rusty Grant, Brighton-5; Todd Cutrie, VVS-3; Andy Sweredoski, Lowville-3, and Travis Kidder, Mexico-3. Kidder won by three quick falls - :23, 1:47, and :41 to Most Falls trophy (three pins in just 2:51). The Fastest Pin award went to 167pounder Nick Morse of VVS-3. He came out in round one and stuck Jeff Veeder of Madison-Morrisville-Eaton in just 17 seconds.

He won twice after that, then fell in just 31 seconds himself to Chris Brown of Chittenango- for fifth .



Hughes MOW at TC³ JC Tournament







Four New Yorkers Capture Titles at Historic RIT Invitational

RIT Dec 6-7 One of New York State's longest-running collegiate tournaments recently concluded its 26th annual edition. The RIT (Rochester Institute of Technology) Invitational, masterminded by head coach Earl Fuller, ended with Division I Kent State easily winning first place. With six champs, two runners up, and two other top-four placefinishers, they won with a score of 172 points. Second place went to Ithaca College with 100.75, followed by first-year Division I Buffalo at 94, Ashland 83, Binghamton 78, Owwego 50.5, Franklin & Marshall 50, Cortland 24.75, Norwich 24, Kean 22.5, and host RIT 7.5

This historic event was first competed in 1966, with Clarkson and Thiel tying for first with 35 points, followed by Case at 28 and RIT with 25. Over the years, it's added and dropped teams, creating a rich and diverse list of past champions and placewinners. The tournament boasts only six three-time champions: John Janiak, Syracuse; Joe Giani, Brockport; Frank Famiano, Brockport; Darrell Leslie, RIT; Rick DiCola, Ashland; and Dan Jones, Case.

Four New Yorkers captured titles this year, Len Bruehwiler, 134, Ithaca; Ken Kaufman, 150, Binghamton; Dan Uhteg, 190, Ithaca; and Steve Farr, hwt, Ithaca. Bruehwiler was originally seeded second. He won two close matches (5-3 and 2-0) to gain the finals against top-seeded He⁴b Pinkney of Ashland. There, he won the shootout, 12-7, in the evening's highestscoring finals match.

Kaufman was also seeded second, with defending champ Jim Andrassy of Kent State first. To reach the finals, Ken won by 14-3 and 4-1. Once there, he scored a brilliant upset, 4-3, for his title.

Uhteg continued winning by taking four matches by a combined score of 41-8. His finals opponent was top-seeded Chris Albert of Kent State, whom he beat 5-2.

At heavy, the fourth second-seeded New Yorker came through to win a title, with Ithaca's Steve Farr surprising Joe Muscarella of Buffalo in a super-exciting 1-1, 3-1 overtime win.

Eric Unger, 167 pound champ from Kent State, won Most Outstanding Wrestler Award. He also won the title last year.
