The death of Professor Dole, Coach of the team previous to this season and Olympic champion in 1912, all but cut short the history of wrestling at St. Lawrence. When it was finally decided to continue the sport, Coach John Oliver was secured to take charge of the sport, and he succeeded in rounding out a strong team for St. Lawrence.

Three meets were included on the 1928-29 wrestling schedule, the Larries winning one and losing two. The Norwich match, the only home meet of the season, created considerable interest in the sport, and in the future, wrestling should develop into one of the leading minor sports at St. Lawrence.

Coach Oliver counted his main strength in the heavier classes. Captain Latham, Paige, and MacAndrews proved three of the strongest grapplers in the state. In every meet, no matter how stiff the competition, three could always be relied upon to score for the Larries. For three years they have been outstanding, and the graduation of the trio will leave the Scarlet considerably weakened in the heavier weights. The loss of Pelton will be felt in the lighter weights.
