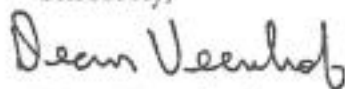


Dear Athletes and Fans,

Catholic League looks to gain Respect.

The Catholic League comes into the state tournament this year boasting it's best team ever. This year's team consists of 6 returning qualifiers from 1998 hoping to improve on last year's performance.

St. Anthony's High School which captured the Catholic Triple Crown sends six wrestlers (school record) to this year's tournament.

At **96 lbs.**, St. Anthony's sophomore, **Keith Eckert** (16-6) makes his first appearance at the state tournament.

103 lbs., boasts St. Anthony's freshman **Lucas Magnani** (26-2). Magnani is a Section XI runner-up at 96 lbs., in 1998. Magnani, a gold medalist in Freestyle at the 98 Empire State Games, possess the skills and talent to have a very successful tournament.

The **112 lbs.** representative, also in his first appearance is Chaminade sophomore, **Andrew Sampson** (22-7).

Mount St. Michael's **119 lb.** senior, **Rory Davidson** (27-3) makes his third and final appearance at the state tournament. Davidson hopes that 2 previous appearances have given him the experience he needs in order to improve on past performances.

125 lbs. has Chaminade senior **John Paul Igoe** (30-2) making his second appearance, with plans to join the state elite.

Kellenburg Memorial sends **130 lb.** senior **Anthony Sollicito** (24-4) in his first appearance.

Jose Osorio (29-4), a senior from St. Anthony's comes in at **135 lbs.** this year. Head coach, Tony Walters, feels Osorio's consistency throughout the season will be a great advantage in this year's tournament.

Two time qualifier, **Lou Dionisio** (21-1), a junior from Holy Trinity weighs in at **140 lbs.**, this year.

Junior **Alex Hug** (37-0) (Fordham Prep.) is the **145 lb.** qualifier.

Evan Howard (27-2), a **152 lb.** junior from St. Anthony's makes his second appearance at the state tournament. Howard

hopes to improve on last year's devastating 2-1 overtime lost in the Consolation quarterfinals to eventual 4th place finisher Rich Petraca (Section XI)

160 lb. St. Anthony senior, **Mike Fiorvanti** (28-3) a talented two sport star, who will attend Brown University in the fall on a Lacrosse scholarship, hopes to redeem himself after last year's loss to champion Noel Thompson (Section VIII).

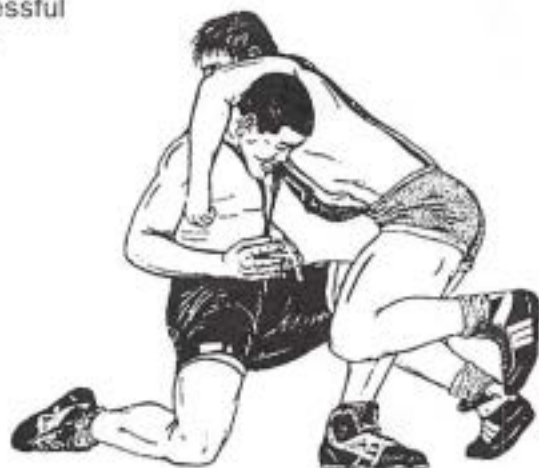
171 and 215 lbs. have seniors **John Rysiejko** (17-2) (Xavier) and **John Higgins** (28-5) (Chaminade) making their first appearances.

Chaminade senior **Phil Murawski** (22-3) weighs in at **189 lbs.**, this year. Murawski hopes that a successful senior campaign has given him the experience needed to have a successful tournament.

Rounding out this year's team is **275 lb.** senior from St. Anthony's **Joe Minucci**. Minucci comes in to this years tournament at 21-0. Minucci also a successful All Long Island football player will be attending the University of Delaware on a football scholarship.

St. Anthony's coach, Tony Walters, expects the team to do well in this year's tournament. "What we want is a little respect for our kids, they work just as hard as the public school athletes and should be treated with the same respect."

If there ever was a year to make a point this is the year.



Can Section Four Repeat?

Led by a pair of returning state champions from Ithaca high, nearby Section Four (Binghamton-Ithaca area) will bid to repeat as sectional team champion of the 37th annual State Wrestling Tournament.

Last year's 96-pound champion, Joel Walsh, and his teammate, two-time state champion Brandon Lehman, return for Ithaca. Lehman will seek his third state title as he vies at 125 pounds this weekend, up from 119 of last March.

Walsh and Lehman helped Section Four score 219 points to finish first last year at the War Memorial, ahead of Section Eleven (209) and Section Two (204.5). Again this year, those trio of strong sections loom as the top three contenders for team honors, though there are a few more contenders as well.

If Section Four repeats, it will need solid efforts from its lightweights, headed by Walsh (35-1) at 103, unbeaten Nick Richetti (33-0) of Waverly at 119, four-time Section Four champion Lehman (37-0), and another Ithaca High athlete, returning 130-pound Dave Leonardo (35-4). Another highly-touted twosome are unbeaten Brent Ryder (38-0) of Tioga at 140 pounds and three-time Section Four champion Joe Downey (32-0) of Norwich at 189. Downey finished third and second here in two past State Meet treks.

As wrestling begins, the field includes seven defending champions, and that number includes two athletes seeking third state crowns. Besides Lehman, the other returning two-time state champion is Jesse Jantzen (34-0) of Shoreham-Wading River - 11. Only a junior, Jantzen recently became the winningest wrestler in Long Island history as he pushed his career record to 170-3. Jantzen already has a third and two firsts to show for his trio of previous trips to Syracuse, and is aiming to be a four-time state champion. He very likely will be.

Other 1998 champions who return are 130-pound Mike Messina of Hauppauge - 11, 152-pound John Clark of Canton/Potsdam - 10, 215-pound Josh Etu of Queensbury - 2 and 275-pound Bob Hafler of Niskayuna - 2.

If Section Four fails to repeat, an experienced team from Section Two (Albany area) might gain its second team title in 37 years. That section won here in 1982, and is usually a contender. Led by its mammoth twosome of Etu and Hafler, that area owns a muscular team. All-State football player Etu, who was named "Most Outstanding Wrestler" here last March, has already accepted a wrestling scholarship offer from the University of Virginia.

Another outstanding Section Two wrestler is five-time sectional champion Greg Parker (39-0) of Shenendehowa at 152 pounds. Parker was runner-up here at 135 last year. Parker and defending state king Clark of Canton/Potsdam could collide in a superb state title bout before your eyes on Saturday night.

Followers of Section Two also point to the talents of 103-pound Justin Grupe (29-2) of Galway, 112-pound Shawn Miller (34-2) of Niskayuna, 119-pound Matt Stenglein (38-1) of Colonie and 135-pound Matt Herrington (40-0) of Troy LaSalle as four more reasons for optimism. This team will be in the hunt.

Also a perennial contender is Section Eleven (Suffolk County, L.I.) and this year will certainly be no exception. Returning champions Messina at 130 pounds and Jantzen at 145 lead a squad which has finished first at "States" ten previous years, the most recent being 1994.

Also for Section Eleven, top pointgetters look to be 96-pound Rob Vaccaro (31-2) of East Islip, 112-pound Starlin Jimenez (31-1) of Brentwood, 125-pound Joe Ketcham (29-0) of Longwood, 140-pound Mike Torriero (33-1) of Rocky Point, Joe Patrovich (30-0) of Connetquot at 160, Dan Sable (31-0) of Longwood at 189 and Joel Barone (24-0) of William Floyd at 215.

Also from Long Island, the green-uniformed Section Eight team might improve upon its fourth-place finish of last March. The Nassau County champions are led by a strong crew of veteran upper-weights in returning 152-pound Bill Bennett (32-1) of Levittown Division, unbeaten Eddie Gomez (27-0) of Freeport at 160, returning Tom Katsigiorgis (29-1) of Massapequa at 189 and returning Terry Brown (26-0) of Freeport at 215. Bennett and Brown were placewinners last year.



Another perennial team contender is the host Section Three team, which features a pair of past State Meet placewinners in 135-pound Joel Williams (28-3) of Mexico and 152-pound Dan Horning (31-2) of Baldwinsville. Horning took a third here last year. Williams was a placewinner in 1996, then lost sectional title matches each of the past two years before earning entry into the State Meet again as a senior.

The gold-uniformed Section Three team should also receive points from such talented champions as unbeaten 96-pound Watertown High freshman Joe Jewett (37-0), rugged 130-pound Dan Smith (30-4) of Mexico, unbeaten Dan Morczek (38-0) of South Lewis at 145, sectional, "MOW" Bill Parry of Morrisville-Eaton at 160 and highly-touted junior 171-pounder Nick Hansen (36-1) of Fulton. Up at 215, Brian Platt is 35-0 and the Section Three champion from Jordan-Elbridge, but faces a tough opening matchup with defending king Etu of Queensbury.

Among the "sleepers" in the team scoring race could be Section One, a region which has never finished first. That Westchester/Rockland area squad possesses a handful of returning State Meet placemen, and will score points this weekend. Returning veterans for One are 119-pound Chris Ewing of Sleepy Hollow, 135-pound Frank Pregiato of Suffern, 171-pound Khyll Farrison of Suffern and 189-pound Richard Downer of Ossining.

Another longshot is tiny Section Nine (Orange County area), which features four State Meet veterans in 130-pound Dave Edwards (30-1) of Cornwall, 152-pound Nick Rausenberger (34-1) of Newburgh Free Academy, 171-pound Dave Colabella (36-2) of Monroe-Woodbury and 215-pound Joe Sahl (33-2) of Valley Central.

Further North, Section Ten is paced by unbeaten state champ John Clark (36-0) of Canton/Potsdam. John is the younger brother of 1998 NCAA wrestling champion Mitch Clark of Ohio State. John is also headed to Ohio State to continue his mat career.

To the West, Section Five is led by unbeaten lightweight Gary Borrelli (39-0) of Spencerport at 112 pounds and returning State Meet placemen Shamir Rhodes (36-2) of Rush-Henrietta at 145.

Even further West, Section Six (Buffalo area) points to returning sectional champions Bill Morello (42-1) of Lockport at 135 pounds and Bill Prince (37-2) of Frewsburg at 171 as leaders of the Western New York squad. Named "MOW" for that team was 160-pound Ed Pawlak (42-0) of Jamestown Southwestern.

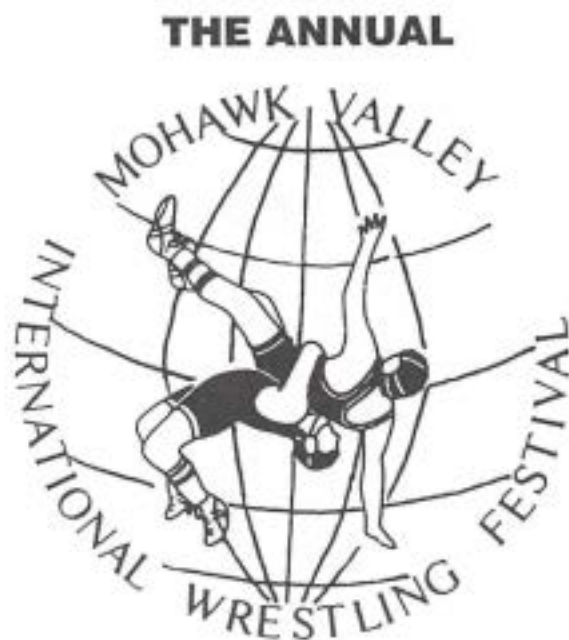
Tiny Section Seven will score some points too, led by the efforts of five sectional champs from Peru Central and five more from Beekmantown.

Again this year, no pre-meet seedings were issued. Pairings were drawn from a box, with returning 1-2-3-4 placemen from the previous year separated into opposite brackets.

Wrestlebacks have long been a part of the tournament to allow once-beaten wrestlers the opportunity to battle back for a respectable third-place finish.

To all champion wrestlers, we in Central New York extend our congratulations for having earned a journey to the 37th annual New York State finals. There have been 492 past state champions over the years, some of whom have gone on to win NCAA crowns and even Olympic Games' medals. (There were three U.S. medal-winners from New York State in 1984, for instance.)

To conclude the State meet, a most outstanding wrestler trophy will be voted upon by the sectional chairmen and working press. Troy Bouzakis of Pine Bush is the only athlete to have won that award twice.

...an introduction to YOUR Association

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The New York State
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promotes education
through participation in
interscholastic athletics.

OBJECTIVES

The Association serves as a central organization through which member high schools in the state may cooperate to:

- Encourage as many pupils as possible to participate in athletic games
- Promote sportsmanlike conduct in all athletic contests
- Maintain essential minimum standards of eligibility
- Provide means to settle disputed athletic contests amicably and authoritatively
- Conduct appropriate athletic meets and tournaments
- Cooperate with the State Education Department in fostering educationally sound athletic programs
- Adapt rules governing sports contests to the particular conditions governing high school competition
- Continually seek data to support rules changes leading to greater safety for high school athletes

1. The NYSPHSAA HANDBOOK and Eligibility Booklets are published biennially and distributed to member schools to ensure administrators and coaches keep abreast of current standards, regulations and policies.

2. Scholastic Athletics, a journal published three times each year, is the Association's main communicator of new developments, issues and points of emphasis to every member school's athletic department and administration. The journal also includes rulebook order forms and a schedule of state tournaments.

3. Safety, Research and Experimentation are conducted through coordinated efforts of the Safety Committee, sport coordinators and the Medical Society of the State of New York.

4. Sportsmanship is addressed through the "New York Good Sports" individual school assessment program, and the publication of a **Sportsmanship Guide** - stressing proactive rather than reactive programs and adopting sportsmanship rules and regulations.

Sportsmanship must be a primary learning standard as students are educated through interscholastic athletic participation.

5. ACTION on TARGET is a program in which leaders from each Section have been trained to be facilitators of drug abuse education and prevention programs. The facilitators conduct annual clinics in each Section, providing members with skills and approaches for conducting programs in their schools and communities.

6. The Scholar Athlete Team Award Program was initiated in 1991 to support the Association's belief that the athletic participation of students enhances their academic performances. Varsity teams who earn a 90.0% or higher average during their sport season qualify for the NYSPHSAA Award.

7. Statewide Sport Committees are organized for each sport supported by the Association. The committees, composed of a chairperson and a representative from each Section participating in that sport, are responsible for game rules, conditions of their sport and the coordination of their championship tournament.

8. State Championship Competitions are conducted for NYS girls and boys in 32 sports.

9. The Media and the Association work cooperatively to provide positive publicity for the state's tournaments and outstanding athletes. A Media Advisory Committee, composed of representatives of newspaper, television and radio organizations, helps the Association establish operating policies and procedures.



10. Sanctioning of Interstate and Int'l Competition is a procedure established to ensure safe and equitable competition for New York State student-athletes, wherever they compete.

11. Consultant Services are provided by the Association to schools, leagues, Sections and allied agencies.

12. A NYS Interscholastic Athletics Records data base is maintained at the Association office.

13. Professional Development Workshops and Clinics are conducted for the staff of member schools, including such topics as eligibility standards, safety issues and coaching techniques.

14. The Officials' Five Point Program ensures that those officiating interscholastic athletic events have proper, ongoing training and certification.

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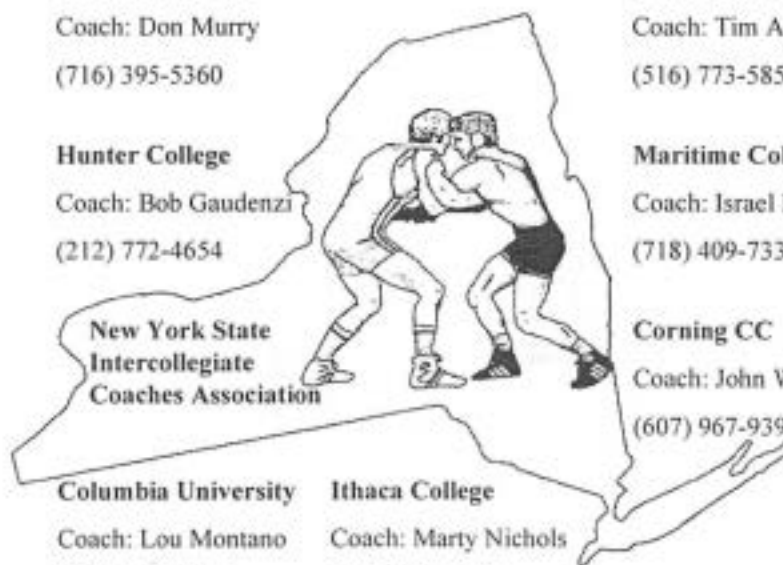

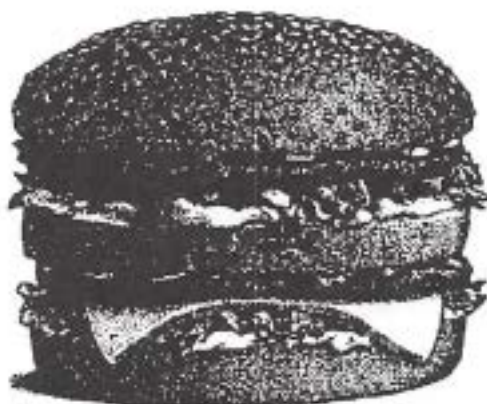

Attention Wrestling Fans!

Two years ago, Syracuse University announced the termination of its eighty-year old wrestling program. Syracuse's official position regarding this announcement was that the elimination of the program was necessary for budgetary reasons (the annual budget for wrestling was approximately \$300,000.00). Promptly afterward, Syracuse announced the creation of a women's softball team and the building of a \$1.5 million dollar women's softball stadium.

In response to this announcement, several former Syracuse wrestlers and friends of Syracuse wrestling created Keep Syracuse Wrestling, Inc. ("KSW"), a not-for-profit organization devoted to fighting to maintain the Syracuse program and advancing the cause of amateur wrestling in New York State.

KSW was able to obtain a four-year reprieve in the termination of the program.

Despite statements to the contrary from Syracuse University, KSW believes the real culprit underlying the decision to eliminate the program is a federal law known as "Title IX." On its face, Title IX seems to require "gender equity" in college sports. However, this law and its application in the federal courts has resulted, like many laws, in unintended consequences.

In 1977, there were over 750 college wrestling programs in the United States; now there are barely 300. At this tournament last year, a KSW member asked that you write your respective representatives in Congress and seek a change in Title IX. Two months after the tournament, KSW telephoned all congressional offices in New York to determine how many letters had been received from state tournament fans regarding Title IX; not one letter had been received. Do not let this happen again! Wrestling needs your support. Congressional representatives will do nothing about this problem if they do not hear from you.

You may obtain the name and address of your congressional representative from your local telephone book. Also, please write Chancellor Shaw of Syracuse University a polite letter urging him to ask the Syracuse Board of Trustees to reconsider Syracuse's decision; his address is: Syracuse University, Chancellor's Office, Administration Building, Syracuse, New York 13210, Attention: Chancellor Kenneth Shaw.

Finally, KSW needs money. In the event KSW is unsuccessful in raising two million dollars by June 30, 2000, the Syracuse program will come to an end. Will Section 4 Repeat?

Once again, Section 4 will look to flex its muscle at the State Wrestling Tournament. Last year's team title added more ammunition for those who say the best area for wrestling in New York is in Section 4. A look at recent state tournament performances helps to make their point.

Section 4 has finished worse than second in the team standings just twice over the last eight years, and has claimed four team titles in that span, including last year's team title. This year's squad should put Section 4 in the title mix. The team has its usual serious state title contenders in 103-pound Joel Walsh (35-1) and 125-pound Brandon Lehman (37-0) of Ithaca, both reigning state champions, 189-pound Joe Downey (32-0) of Norwich, and 215-pound Tim Braman (30-2) of Greene.

Others returning to the state tournament are 130-pound Dave Leonardo (35-4) of Ithaca, 140-pound Brent Rider (38-0) of Tioga, and 119-pound Nick Richetti (39-0) of Waverly, a senior who last made it three years ago as a freshman. All these wrestlers are capable of making serious runs in the tournament.

However, the two most compelling stories out of Section 4 are the title quests of Lehman and Downey.

Lehman, making his fourth state tournament appearance, can become only the 10th wrestler ever to claim three New York State titles.

Section 4 has finished worse than second in the team standings just twice over the last eight years...

Meanwhile, Downey is also making his fourth appearance in the state tournament, but he is looking for his first title. Downey placed second at 171 pounds in last year's tournament, and had finishes of third and fourth in 1997 and 1996. Downey has made no bones about his chances of finally tasting championship glory. "I feel like I'm going to win it this year," Downey said. "I feel stronger than ever before. I plan on (finally) taking the title."

Another interesting story out of Section 4 was Braman, who overcame some adversity to earn his third straight berth in the state tournament. Though a state semifinalist last year, Braman was seeded third in this year's Section 4 tournament at 215 pounds after a 4-3 loss to Walton's Chad Scott in their league championship match. Braman avenged his loss to Scott in the Section 4 semifinals with a 4-3 win, and he pinned previously unbeaten Dave Campbell of Vestal in 5:25 in the finals to win the title. "I felt like some people didn't think I had what it took to win," Braman said. "People saw the loss (to Scott) and that I was the third seed, but I felt that I was still the guy to beat."

A number of wrestlers from Section 4 finally broke through this year, earning their first appearances in the state tournament. Those include 96-pound Lucas Quarella (28-2) of Whitney Point, whose brother Brandon claimed the 103-pound state title in last year's tournament; 112-pound Rob Benedict (29-3) of Trumansburg; 135-pound Rick Webster (28-4) of Horseheads; 145-pound Matt Yonkoski (29-6) of Johnson City; 152-pound Bob Braman of Greene; 160-pound Andrew Locke (34-4) of Bainbridge-Guilford/Afton; 171-pound Andy Browne (37-2) of Tioga and 275-pound Dave Fredenburg (18-1) of Tioga.

All 15 wrestlers from Section 4, and every wrestler here for that matter, dream of winning that state championship. Some have better chances than others, a fact not lost upon Yonkoski, a sophomore who would love to win a title but is just happy to get a taste of this competition. "It would be great to win, obviously," Yonkoski said. "My goal, though, is to at least place in the top five."

So as these next few days unfold, wrestlers, coaches, wrestlers, and fans can all admit one thing: Regardless of what happens this weekend it's going to be a heck of a ride.

Art Connerton started wrestling as a seventh-grader. Fifty years later, the Irondequoit wrestling coach decided to call it a career, retiring at age 61, after 36 years as a coach in Section V. Art had 300 career wins, No. 2 in Section V behind East Rochester's Don Quinn (368).

He led his Indians to three Section V Class A titles and the No. 1 ranking in New York State twice. They won 85 team titles in his tenure. He also coached 34 All-Americans, 3 State champions, 63 wrestlers who placed in the state and 102 who placed in Section V.

Many members of his teams felt the importance of Connerton's presence in not just all of his 300 wins but in their entire wrestling careers.

The Rochester native as a junior high student wrestled for the New York Athletic Club. While in college at SUNY Brockport, Connerton placed eighth and third in the Olympic trials.

During his 36 years of coaching, he always motivated and inspired his wrestlers to carry on the proud tradition of Irondequoit wrestling.

With a long list of accomplishments, Connerton was the measure of wrestling success in wrestling. Known for being a great motivator, he has participated in wrestling camps and clinics all over the country. The secret of his success according to Connerton was, "good kids, good athletes and good dedication."

Frank Soroichinsky is simply known by the USA Wrestling Community as "Sarge". Frank, a 1949 Union Endicott High School Graduate and a 1954 Cornell University Graduate is the winningest coach in New York State History, with a dual meet record of 419-109-2, and a .790 winning percentage.

He started coaching at

Newark Valley High School in 1957 through 1960, and then in 1960 he went back to his Alma Mater to become the first coach in Union-Endicott Wrestling History. From 1957 to 1997 his team has won over 100 Tournament Team Titles which included 11 STAC League Team Titles. Frank had his Union-Endicott's team ranked #1 in the New York State Sports Writer Poll from 1970 to 1974 and once again in 1996 to 1997. But what Frank is dearly known for is his intense dedication to the Union-Endicott student body. In his 37 years of Teaching/Coaching at Union-Endicott, he had seven athletes become NYS Wrestling Champions, while a total of 25 other wrestlers placed in the NYS Championships. As a Chemistry teacher, it is estimated, along with home teaching and summer school that he has

helped over 5,000 students pass the NYS Chemistry Regents. This fact alone was the reason that he was voted Union-Endicott 1967-68 Teacher of the Year. As of 1995, the Southern Tier Athletic Conference Annual Most Valuable Wrestler Award was renamed the "Sarge Award", to honor his years of excellence in the sport of wrestling. His impressive resume also includes the following:

- Empire State Game Scholastic Chairman since 1976

- He was First Lieutenant of the 82nd Airborne and had 29 jumps from 1955 to 1957
- Fulton Wrestling Club Award (over 400 wins)
- 25 Years as a member of the Southern Tier Wrestling Officials Association
- Hosted Foreign Teams from Poland 6 times, Germany 2 times, Sweden 1 time, Iran 1 time, and Japan 1 time

his high school wrestlers earned national recognition. In addition to the success he achieved as a head coach, he also assembled and prepared teams consisting of wrestlers from many different school programs to compete on the international level. All of his teams were extremely successful.

After an outstanding wrestling career which included numerous championships in high school, national and international competition, Gombatista "Jumper" Leggio started a wrestling program at Holy Family High School. His teams won the New York State Catholic School Championships in 1968, 1969 and 1972. Many of

Coach Leggio, however, is best known as the father of KID Wrestling. In 1963, he organized the Bay Shore Kid Charter program which soon spread throughout New York State and many other eastern states. He promoted wrestling for all kids regardless of their physical or mental abilities. Many of New York State's finest wrestlers participated in KID Wrestling programs. It continues to serve as the foundation for wrestling as we know it today.

Through the efforts of Coach Leggio, over the past 38 years, thousands of young people have learned valuable lessons about life. He has made a tremendous impact on many wrestling programs and is an outstanding role model and mentor for both coaches and wrestlers. His level of dedication and commitment to all of the kids that he has coached and inspired is unsurpassed. Coach Leggio is a fine ambassador for the sport of wrestling.

on to wrestle and play football at Montana State University in 1953-57. He saw limited action on the football field but became a four-year starter on the wrestling team, where he became captain and was undefeated during his senior year. The best he could do was two seconds and two thirds at the 123 lb. and 132 lb. weight classes in the Big Sky Conference post-season competition.

After graduating from MSU, Ace taught history and started the first wrestling team in Glendine, Montana. In 1960, Ace was hired to teach history at Niagara-Wheatfield

Armand "Ace" Cacciatore was born and raised in Niagara Falls, where he attended Niagara Falls High School. There he participated in football and track. Ace was the starting quarterback on the 1953 Championship football team and also ran the mile and 1/2 mile on the 1953 Championship track team. Armand went

High School and started the school's first wrestling program. His teams went on to compile an approximate record of 330 wins and 30 losses; 17 Niagara Frontier League championships and at least six Section 6 Championships. Ace has coached one state champ, heavyweight Frank Patterson in 1964, and has also sent 35 wrestlers to the state competition, more than any other coach in Section 6. Niagara-Wheatfield was once ranked fourth in N.Y.S. and his teams were able to enjoy two separate winning streaks of 55 and 75 consecutive wins in league competition. Ace retired from wrestling in 1993.

Armand would like to thank Jesus for being his Head Coach and for all his guidance and blessings throughout his career. He is also very grateful to all the wrestlers, football players and assistant coaches who have helped him to have successful programs in both sports. Most of all, he would like to share this honor with all of them along with his loving wife, Mimi, his best friend and cheerleader.

Armand humbly accepts this award and gives thanks to the N.Y.S. Wrestling Committee from the bottom of his heart for his induction into this prestigious Wrestling Hall of Fame.

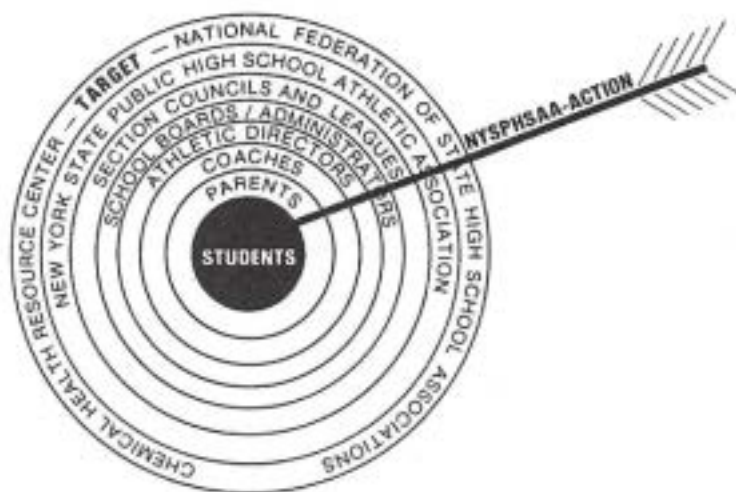

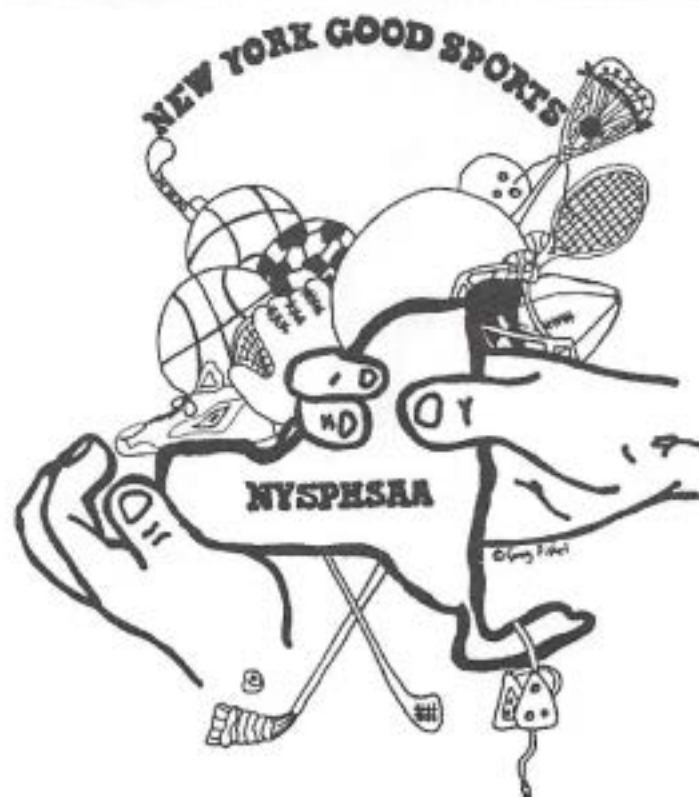

1. A genuine interest in and enjoyment of interscholastic competition requires conduct that reflects the understanding that contests as a part of an overall schools program are intended to be enjoyed. Behavior that reflects a winning at all costs attitude violates this standard.
2. Interscholastic competition provides valuable lessons and learning experiences that are not possible in the regular classroom. All involved must support the need to develop the ability to compete with enthusiasm and to accept winning with grace and losing with dignity.
5. Players should demonstrate both knowledge of the rules and respect for the game officials and their decisions. Coaches and school officials have the responsibility to teach and encourage these attributes.
