# SEASON ROUNDUP: AN EDITORIAL

Wrestling coaches and officials in Section V have completed another season of activity. It has proven to be a very interesting season and one with more than the usual number of ups and downs.

We added at least seven new schools to the growing list of those with interscholastic wrestling. The Wrestling Coaches and Officials Association has grown too. WCOA has topped all previous membership records with a total of 60 members.

Four clinics this year were attended by more than 1000 wrestlers, coaches, officials, and interested spectators. RoloTo coach Earl Fuller once again was of invaluable assistance to Section V wrestling through his efficient conduct of the clinics. He is also to be congratulated on the fine season record compiled by his team against some top-flight collegiate competition. Jack Hantz, Clarkson coach, assisted in work to improve the caliber of wrestling by a presentation at the Rochester clinia on December 12.

Monroe county schools sponsored the largest and most successful wrestling tournament in their history. This is a growing event.

Efforts to standardize officiating in the state and section are meeting with increased success. Officiating this year has shown more consistency in calls and interpretations. This year's experiences should lead to even better organization of officials next year.

The first ensolite mat was purchased for use by a City of Rochester (Maduer) school and more are hoped for by other city coaches. This year, Rochester schools cut down their representation and seemed to take a step backwards when they pulled consolationists out of the Section V tournament.

Thirteen Monroe County schools also did an about face when they dropped from the sectional tournament in favor of a single County tournament. It is to be hoped that a satisfactory plan can be worked out for next years Section V Tournament so that participation will be truly representative of the section.

We can't afford to panic because we have a growing tiger by the tail. We should strive to improve more than ever the quality and quantity of educational participation in wrestling. Unselfish work by teachers and coaches is the only way this can be accomplished: Attend coaches and officials meetings and clinics; Express your views; make suggestions; discuss with others ways of building interest; experiment with rules changes and weight control measures; promote in the school and community; keep your eyes and ears and mind open all year around.
