## Four Mustang Grapplers Capture N-O League Titles \*

ALBION - Capturing the spotlight, a quartet of Medina High wrestlers claimed titles here last night at the 25th annual Niagara-Orleans League championships

Senior Willie Wilson (167), juniors Eric Gross (177) and Jose Hernandez (138) and eighth grader Eric Vaughn (91) all captured championships for the Mustangs at the silver anniversary edition of the N-O Tourney. The title was the second for Vaughn and the first for Wilson, Gross and Hernandez, who was named the tourney's MVP.

Regular season champion Newfane, which placed a total of 12 wrestlers in the finals, emerged with three winners including Jason Wilson (98), Matt Dawson (132) and Jason Ethridge (155). The N-O title was the fifth for

Host Albion was represented on the

victory stand by Kevin Hillman (112) and Joe McVige (126) while Roy-Hart placed Jason Collins (105), who is now a three-time N-O champion.

Starpoint, likewise, had two winners in Aaron Class (145) and Art Dispenza (250), who is now a two-time

Akron's Daric Brege (215) and Wilson's Aaron Cobb (119) round out the championship All-League squad.

Vaughn, after scoring first period pins over Wilson's Paul Myers in the quarterfinals and Newfane's Gary Watier in the semis, decisioned his teammate Aaron Harmer to go to 25-6 on the season and claim his second straight N-O chamionship.

Hernandez upended Newfane's previous unbeaten (27-0-1) Allen Gerhardt 10-4 to claim the 138 lb. title and earn tourney MVP honors. Now at

Gross avenged a narrow 3-2 regular season loss, by outdueling Roy-Hart's Jarred Lake 7-2 in overtime to capture the 177 lb. championship. Now at 27-3 on the season, Gross notched a quick 59 second pin over Starpoint's Bill Barone in the quarterfinals and then decisioned Albion's Chris Vogt in the semis. Lake scored a second period pin over Akron's Bruce Cummings in his semifinal round match.

Medina also had a trio of third place finishers in Binh Hua (126), Ted Howard (215) and David Mahnke (250).

Advancing to the finals via a pin and an injury default, Hillman claimed the 112 lb. crown by nipping Newfane's Craig Hinkley 2-0 in the finals. The win improves Hillman's season record to 20-3-1 while Hinkley slips to 23-8.

Overcoming a painful rib injury, Joe McVige bested Newfane's Bo King 14-6 to capture the 126 lb. championship. McVige, who is now 23-3 on the season, advanced to the finals via a superior decision win over Starpoint's Greg Seefeldt in the quarterfinals and a first period pin over Hua in the semis.

Collins earned his third straight N-O championship by downing Starpoint's Bill Smith 8-2 in the finals. Now at 19-6-1 on the season, advanced to the finals via a major decision win over Albion's Jamie Nickerson and a second period pin over Newfane's Ryan Teague.

Albion also had three third place finishers in Nickerson, Willie Thomas (155) and Vogt. Brandon Sharpsteen (98) and Dan Coe (112) likewise both earned third place finishes for Roy-

Dawson, who is rapidly approaching the 150 career victory mark, captured his record fifth straight N-O title by downing Albion's Jeremy McVige 6-2 in the finals. Dawson notched two pins to reach the title match.

Next up will be the Section VI state qualifier tournament to be held this coming weekend at Sweet Home.
