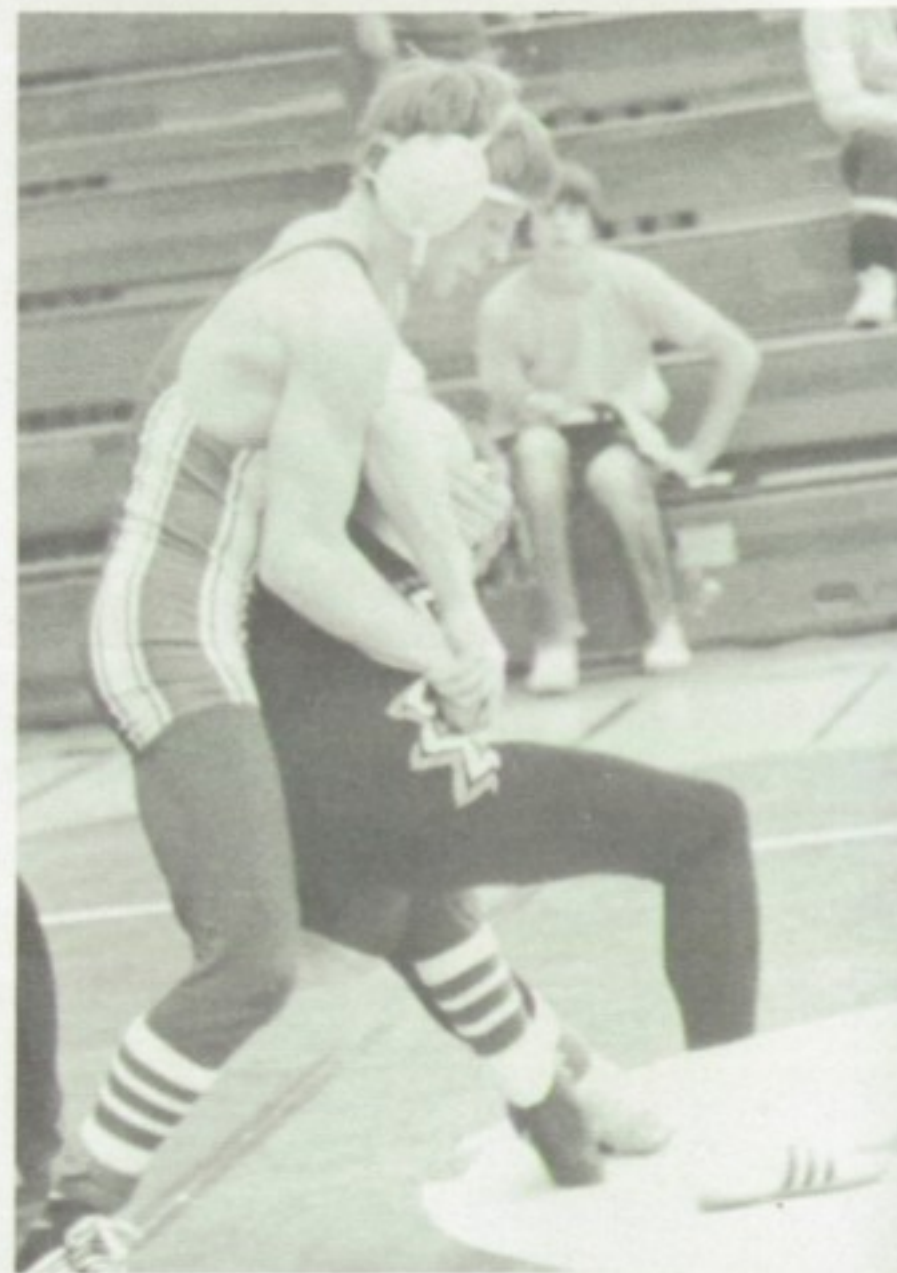
shall 145 lbs., Paul Russell 167 lbs., Pete Russell Hwt. Freshman Calvin Swanson went beyond this and qualified for State competition.

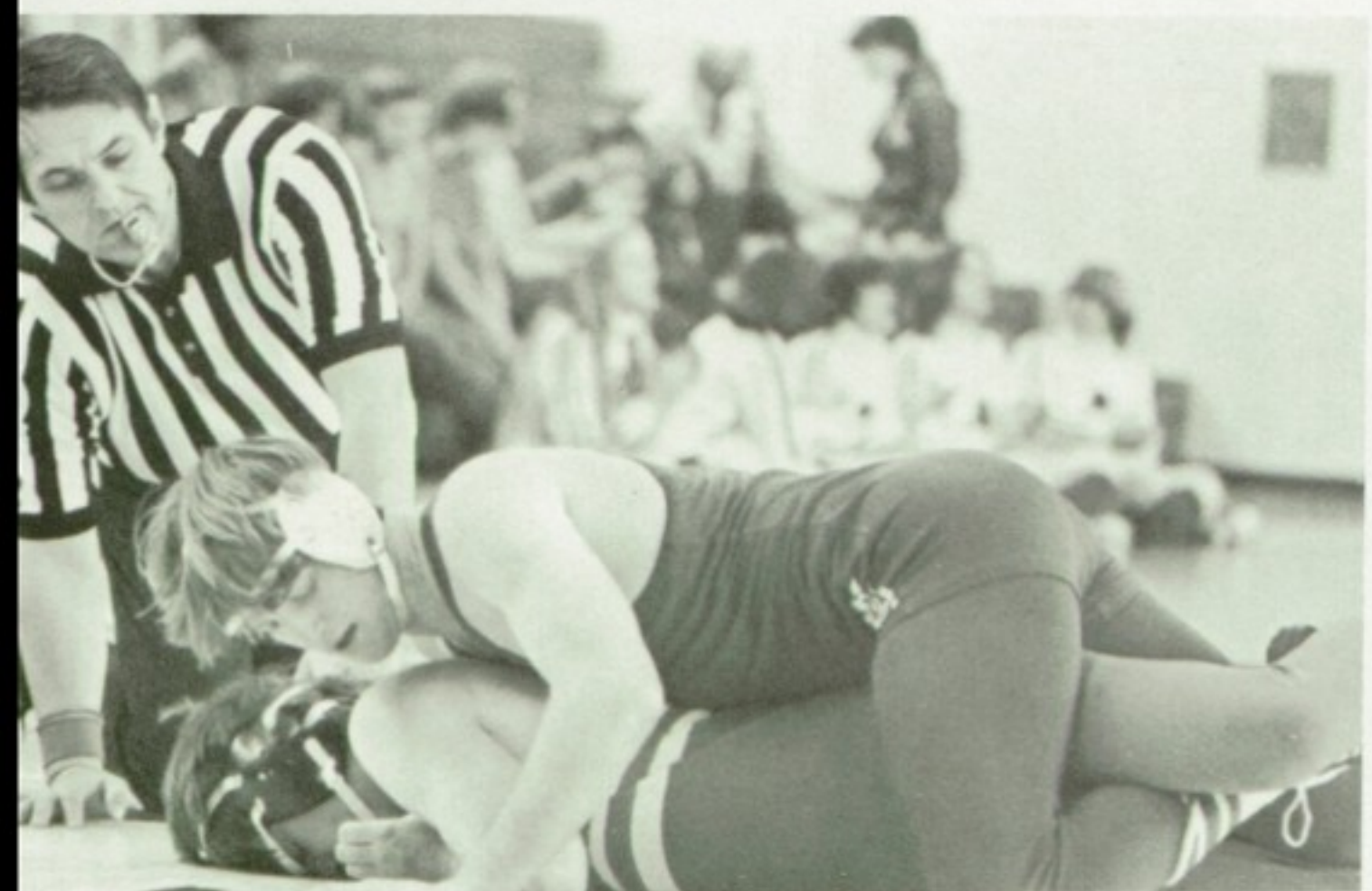

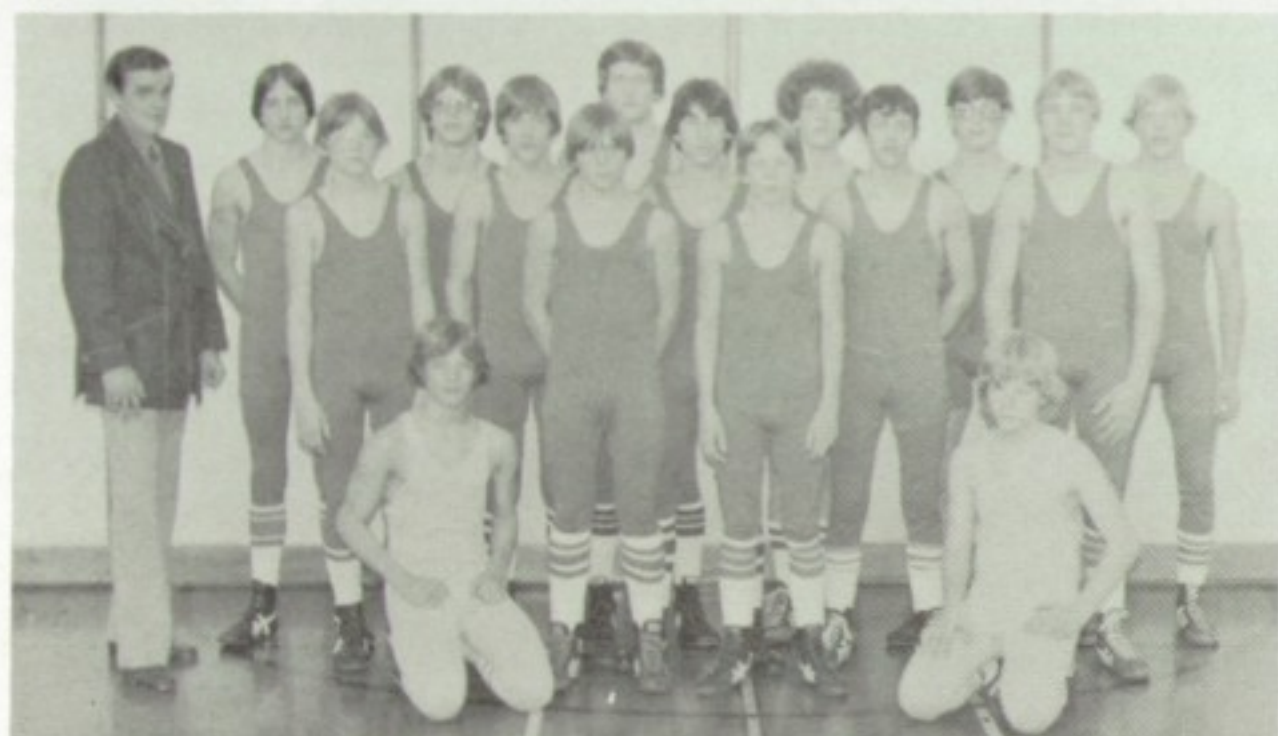
