# IC Pays Penalty For 7-Man Team

Ithaca College's mat team paid the penalty for being short one competitor last night in Seneca gym. The 5 points it gave away at the outset were more than the difference as Rochester Tech won, 18-17.

Thus three pins by the big wheels of the Bomber lineup served little more than to let their cohorts in the capacity crowd blow off a little steam. In rapid order Ross Violi, 167; Ray McFarlane, 177; and Tiny Marella, heavy-weight, spilled their rivals. That quickly built the deficit up from 18-2 to 18-17—still a mite short.

The defeat was Ithaca's fifth straight since winning its opener at Clarkson. It wrestles Oswego here on Wednesday. Rochester won for the seventh time in eight matches.

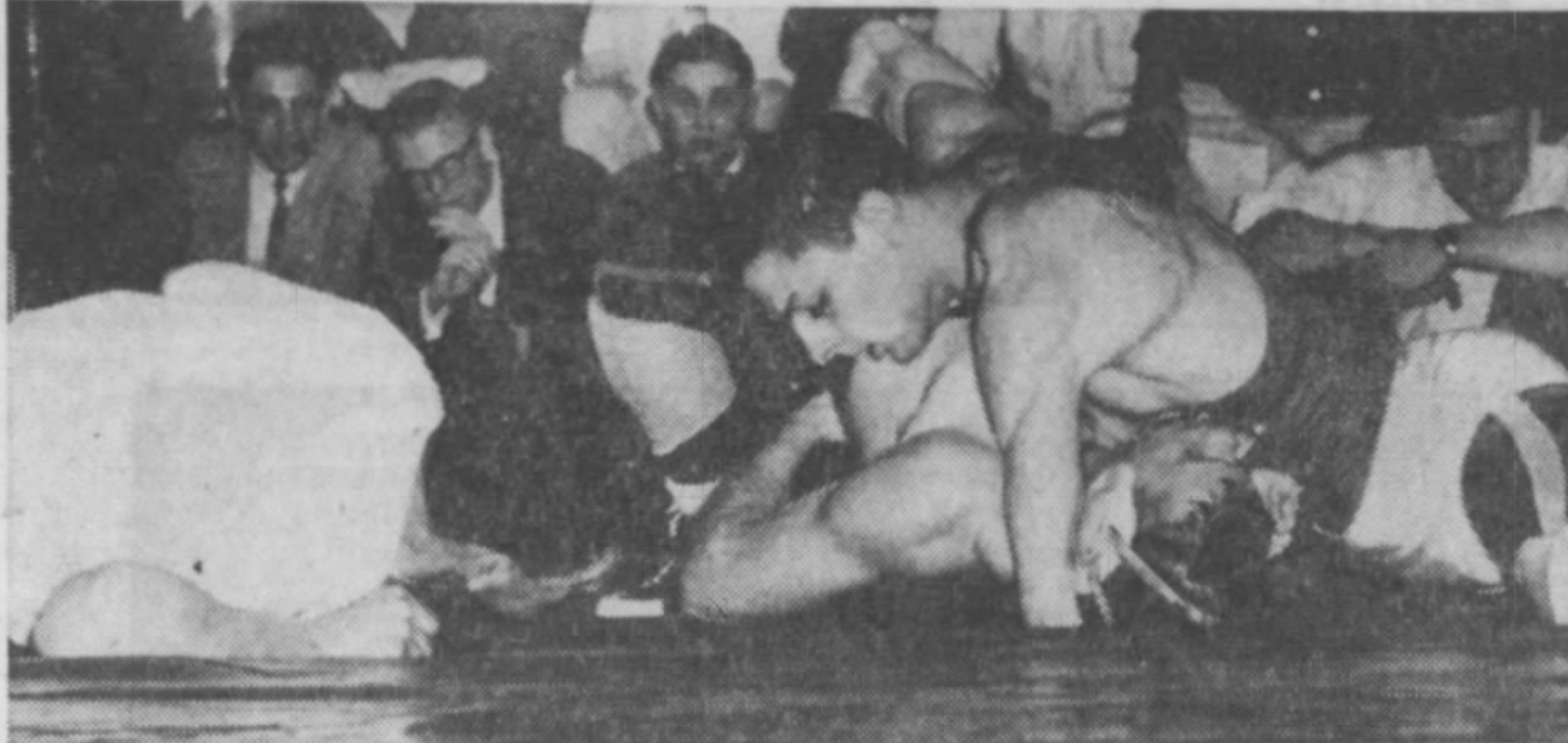
The Rochester Tech Frosh also won the preliminary from the Ithaca youngsters, 24-8. One of the Ithaca victors was John Sacchi, an Ithaca boy, who won in the 137. Heavyweight Duane Hazelton gained the other five points with a quick 1:01 pin.

Hazelton was only a second slower than the varsity heavy, Marella, who gained his fifth pin of the year in six matches.

Violi, Massena veteran, was ahead of his foe, Bob Lehman, when he got the pin hold. He had a first period takedown. Down under at the start of the second period he got a rapid reversal and followed it up conclusively.

McFarlane's pin was most unexpected. He was the victim of a reversal and a nearfall early in the second period and was behind, 4-2, as time waned. It looked like curtains for him when Rod Rittenhouse got him on his back. McFarlane bridged, then with one supreme effort not only somersaulted backwards out of the predicament but took Rittenhouse with him, turning him and putting the clamps to him in 7:57. His performance had everybody on their feet.

Tony Palmiere, 123-pounder, came here with RIT's best individual record, 6-1, and he still is his team's best. He was given a tough tussle by Jim Valentine. But Jim tired and was fair game when Tony got tough and got a fall in 7:50.

Dave Whitlock, in the 157 for IC, started fast but wilted under the pressure. . . The 147 was a high-scoring 14-7 affair. . . But for high scoring you can't beat the 123-pound frosh match in which RIT's Tom Dollar outpointed Ray Greiner, 20-8. Dollar had nine takedowns, two reversals and riding time. Greiner had six escapes. Coach Herb Broadwell has extended every effort to plug the gap in the IC lower weights. Another effort failed early this week when Brian Wade was forced out with an injury.
