Delhi's Matmen Take Third Place In Regionals

Coach Ernest Fierro's Bronco Matmen travel to Alfred Ag and Tech, February 21-22 for the National Junior College Regional III C ampionship. This will be the second annual Regional III championship competitions.

Last year's Regional III held at Delhi Tech was won by Paul Smith's College with 71 points team told followed by Alfred's 61 points and Delhi Tech's 58 points. Corning Community College, Alfred Tech, Onondaga Community and Delhi Tech all with respectable records, will be looking forward to unseat Paul Smith's this year.

Delhi Tech Broncos are 6-2 for the season going into the Regional Competition. The State University of New York Agricultural and Technical Institute Broncos at Delhi have a regular

season match scheduled with Cobleskill Ag & Tech, after the Regionals, at Delhi Tech campus Wednesday, February 26, 8:00 p.m.

Coach Fierro stated he expects to take ten boys to the Regionals—James Romano, a construction major from West Babylon, wrestling in the 115 pound class; John Carpenter, 123, agriculture major, Glen Gardner, N. J., 5-3 on the season, 3-0 on Regional Competition; Joe Morris, 130, 4-4 on season, 1-3 regional, accounting major, Sidney; Phil Sherwood, 137, Greene, business major, 6-2 season, 3-1 regionals—has broken several Delhi Tech records; Bruce Robinson, 147, Cooperstown, construction major, 4-2 and 1 season, 2-0 and 1 regional; Aurdle Martin, 157, Windsor, 0-1 season, 0-1 regional, agri-

culture major; Jerry Patrick, 167, accounting major, Sidney, 6-1 & 1 season—all six wins were by pins, the tie came against Ed Anna, Alfred Tech's last year's regional champ, 3-0-1 regional. Coach Fierro is counting heavily on Jerry's performance at Alfred; Robert Braaten, 177, Freeport, accounting major, 1-3 season, 0-2 regional; Larry Thorsen, 191, Brockport, construction major 5-2 season, 3-1 regional; Bill Bemis, Hvt., Glens Falls, construction major, 1-3 season, 0-1 regional.

Coach Fierro in assessing the Regional III at Alfred Ag & Tech, stated. "This year's team is well balanced, and the individual outlook at the regionals are excellent. We hope to have one or two of the boys participating in the National Championships at Warrington, Minnesota."
