

# WESTERNERS ADVANCE IN COLLEGE TOURNEY

## Oklahoma University and Oklahoma Aggies Will Battle for Edge in Semi-final Bouts; Kansas State and Aggies Tie for Points

STATE COLLEGE, Pa., March 28.—Oklahoma University and Oklahoma Agricultural College, time-honored rivals in their own State, will battle it out for the edge in semi-finals of the third annual wrestling tournament of the National Collegiate Athletic Association being held at Penn State College as a result of today's preliminaries and quarter finals. The University team qualified five, one more than its Aggie rival. The University of Illinois also qualified four.

The Aggies and Kansas State are leading in points, however, each with two as a result of falls scored in today's matches. Nine other teams scored one point each for a fall.

### State's Matmen Fall

Penn State's entries were eliminated early in the grappling, three of them being put out in the preliminaries and one tonight in the quarter final. This last, Paul Long, 175-pounder, put up a valiant fight against Eubanks, of Oklahoma University, but lost by the narrow margin of 26 seconds in two extra periods.

The forty-six bouts on the day's card produced several fast matches in addition to the Long-Eubanks fracas, particularly that between Berry of Oklahoma University, and McGuirk, of the Aggies, which had to go two extra periods to a decision. Watkins, another Oklahoma entry from the State Teachers' College, and Juhl, of Iowa State, also had to go two extra periods and was the next best match of the day.

The shortest bout of the day was the final match in the heavyweight class, Errington, of Kansas State, throwing Boyd, of Waynesburg, in 1.9. Bobby Pearce, 115-pounder of the Oklahoma Aggies, flopped McCarthy, of Cornell College, in 1.23, for the next best time for a fall.

The Eastern contingent qualified only two men, Stella, of Tufts, 125-pounder, and Axford, of M. I. T., 115-pounder. All other Easterners were eliminated in the first or second round. Virginia Military Institute qualified two men for the only Southern representation.

### Champions Move Up

All five of the 1929 champions came through the first two rounds with comparatively little difficulty, although Vanbebber, of Oklahoma Aggies, nearly lost to Solano, of Harvard, in the 165-pound class. The Harvard man nearly pinned the Westerner with a body chancery and double-arm lock early in the match, but the latter wriggled loose and eventually gained a substantial time advantage.

Vanbebber defaulted his 155-pound title won last year to enter the next higher class. Caldwell, the 175-pounder from Oklahoma Aggies, defaulted his 165-pound crown, to take the higher class. Sapora, of Illinois, Mantooth, of Oklahoma University, and McCready, of Oklahoma Aggies, were the other defending titlists. Each won his bout handily.

One outstanding entry was eliminated in the afternoon, Tomlinson, of Oklahoma Aggies, losing to Lewis of the State University, who seems to be the class of the division.

Other teams to qualify men were Northwestern, Iowa State, Kansas State, Virginia Military Institute and University of Michigan two each; Chicago, M. I. T., Tufts, Cornell College, University of Kansas, Oklahoma State Teachers, Indiana, Missouri and Ohio State one each.
