STATE COLLEGE, Pa., March 29 (A. P.)—Combining their rugged forces in the heavy classes, the Oklahoma Aggies won the National Collegiate Association wrestling championship for the third straight year tonight, clinching the title as three of their crack grapplers pulled down national titles.

Piling up twenty-one points through three first places and six points awarded for scoring six falls during the preliminary matches yesterday, the semi-finals and finals tonight, the Aggies, master of the meet since its inauguration three years ago, piled up a margin that could not be beaten, although several second and third place points had to be decided by additional bouts.

champions in the 165-pound class, 175 and unlimited, while Oklahoma University shared the spotlight with individual champions in both the 125 and 145-pound classes. Although no other school was able to win more than one first place, all the titles went West, the last of the Eastern entries losing out in the semi-final round this afternoon.

Three defending champions, Joe Sepora, of Illinois, in the 115-pound division; Lawrence Mantooth, from the University of Oklahoma, in the 125-pound bracket, and Earl McCready, Oklahoma Aggie heavyweight who tossed every opponent he faced for quick falls, all retained their crowns. Two champions of last year, Jack Van Bebber and Conrad Caldwell, both of the Oklahoma Aggies, stepped up a class apiece and won new titles in the 165-pound and 175-pound brackets, respectively.

Iowa State, which vies with Oklahoma in the production of fine college wrestlers, produced one champion in Hugh Linn, conqueror of the 135-pounders, while Otto Kelley, of the University of Michigan, took the 155-pound title back to his school. Not an Easterner or Southerner in a field that comprised 32 schools and 99 combatants was able to win past the semi-finals.

Only one final bout was won on a fall, Earl McCready pinning the shoulders of Lloyd Burdick, of Illinois, in two minutes 17 seconds. Most of the matches were bitterly hard and close, two of them needing two extra periods for decision. Only Joe Sepora, the Illinois mite, won his title in the 115-pound class by default when Marvin Leach, of Oklahoma University, was forced out with a sprained elbow.
