Webster Schroeder junior Gregor Gillespie, 34-0, has been unbeatable so far this year. Last year's state champion, at 119, was named the most outstanding wrestler of the event after he

won the 130-pound class to become a four-time league cham-

pion.
"I always have high energy,"
said Gillespie, who has won 80
consecutive matches. "I love the

sport.
"I'll always remember the counties being here. I'm com-

fortable here."
Eastridge East Irondequoit senior Mike Wood became a three-time county champion after he edged Rush-Henrietta 140-poun-

der Larry LaRussa, 5-4.

"My senior year I definitely wanted to get this," said Wood, who became his school's all-time win leader with 130. "I'm only the second three-time

county champ from Eastridge."
Wood briefly fell behind to
LaRussa 4-3 but pulled off a reversal at the mat circle's edge an

instant after the Rush-Henrietta wrestler scored a takedown. "I had teched and pinned my

way through the tournament up until this match," said Wood, who rode LaRussa for much of the third period. "I knew he was going to be a tough kid. We were the two top dogs."

It only made sense that Spen-

cerport, ranked No. 1 in the state, showed that it was Monroe County's top team again. The Rangers totaled 297.5 points. 126 more than runner-up

Brockport, to win the team title for the 13th consecutive season. "Coach (Bill Jacoutot) puts it into our heads that hard work and determination will take us where we want to go," said

Spencerport's Mike Terenzi, the 145-pound county champion. "It's a tradition we want to continue as long as possible."

Terenzi defeated Irondequoit's Albert Gianforti, 5-l, to become one of four league champions from Spencerport.

Derek Gray at 112, 125-pounder Brett Woodward, and undefeated Alex Baxter (29-0) at 189 also won their weight classes.

Greece Athena's Jason McGuckian kept his cool after he was taken down by Brockport's Sean Riley with 24.2 seconds remaining in the 152-pound

championship.
Down 3-2 after he was let up to his feet, McGuckian timed a shot perfectly to put Riley down with 17.5 to go. McGuckian rode Riley the final 10 seconds to hang on and win.
