LCS Matmen Top Medina To Take Third In Tourney

Three straight early pins sparked Lyndonville to a 40-21 victory over host Medina Saturday for third place in the annual MHS Team Wrestling Tournament.

Pavilion held on for a narrow 30-29 victory over Rush-Henrietta in the championship match.

Pavilion routed LaSalle 63-6 in the opening round. The Gophers then bested Genesee Region League rival Lyndonville 37-18 in the semifinals.

Rush-Henrietta downed Lew-Port 31-24 in the quarterfinals and Medina 35-28 in the semis.

Lyndonville opened the tourney with a 54-15 romp over North Tonawanda while Medina belted Pembroke 48-15.

In the losers bracket, Lew-Port ousted Pembroke 57-9 and North Tonawanda eliminated LaSalle 60-9. Medina then downed North Tonawanda 55-12 and Lyndonville bested Lew-Port 36-30 to reach the consolation round match.

Consecutive pins by Dave Duncanson (105), Don Duncanson (112) and Rick Siebert (119) gave Lyndonville an early 18-6 lead over Medina in the match for third place, which the Tigers never relinquished.

Decision wins by John Pike (132) and Scott Siebert (145), sandwiched around a pin by Dave Wells (138), upped Lyndonville's advantage to a commanding 30-12 with only four bouts to go. A major decision win by Jeff Dix (167) locked up the victory

for the Tigers, which was capped off by a pin by Jackie Stewart (215).

Pins by Bing Hua (98), and Henry Banks (177), along with a technical fall win by Craig Gross (126), accounted for most of Medina's points.

R-H Places Second In 32 Team Tourney

JAMESTOWN - Roy-Hart posted a strong second place finish in the 32 team Southern Tier Wrestling Officials Tournament held at Jamestown Community College here over the weekend.

Roy-Hart garnered a total of 183 points for the tourney, to finish a close second to champion Hickory, Pennsylvania which had 187. Southwestern (172), Spencerport (171) and East Rochester (168) rounded out the top five finishers.

Rob Jacquin (91) and Lou Rosselli (119) both earned individual championships for Roy-Hart. Mark Baehr (138) and Jerry Behe (177) both took second places for the Rams as Nelson Colley (126) and Kevin Lawson (215) both took thirds and Bill Bruning (250) a fifth.

Jacquin, who was seeded first, decisioned Sean Justin of Spencerport 6-3 in the semis and Ray Frey of East Rochester 8-7 in the finals.

Also a No. 1 seed, Rosselli decisioned Chris Bannister 9-6 in the semis and Kyle Chezaof Hickory, a defending Pennsylvania state champion, 11-2 in the title match. Rosselli and Jacquin are now both 5-0 on the young season after going 4-0 in the tourney.

Baehr dropped an 8-5 decision to Chris LoPresti of Spencerport in the finals after decisioning Eric Geyer of East Rochester 2-0 in the semis. Baehr went 4-1 in the tourney and is now 5-1 on the season.

Behe, who likewise went 4-1 on the weekend, notched a pin in his semifinal round match.
