

# Mixed Mats-es . . . Intersectionally

The Section 4 wrestlers who will compete in the state intersectionals at South Huntington, L. I. tomorrow won't be facing defending champion Section 8 right off the bat after all.

It develops that there is a preliminary round of bouts before the grapplers go at it on a strictly section against section basis. In this round the Section 4 representatives meet a succession of champions from Sections One, 9, 2 and 6 in that order throughout.

Then the fourth-seeded Sec-

tion 4 survivors meet the top-seeded Nassau County aggregation which will have gone through the prelims against a 9-2-6-1 succession. Second-seeded Section 3 and third-seeded Section 11 are the other contestants in the preliminaries and meet each other in the second round.

Section One covers Westchester County, Section 2 encompasses the Albany-Saratoga-Glens Falls area, Section 6 is the Buffalo region and Section 9 covers Orange, Sullivan and Rockland counties.

If Section 8 is the most formidable, the lineup awaiting the Section 4 entries figures to be far from a push-over. Eric Watts, the 107-pound entry from Suffern, was a sectional champion last year; Dick Sullivan, the 169-pounder from Haverstraw was voted outstanding wrestler in last week's Section Nine showdown, and Brian Lucas, the Scarsdale unlimited entry was intersectional heavyweight champion last year. He's ineligible to defend that title this year because of the new regulation that puts a 235-pound ceiling on the heavyweight division.
