Wrestling to Start Early Next Month

Intramural wrestling will start at the beginning of March according to the schedule below.

Fraternity teams will be made up of sixteen men, to wrestle in weights from 115 to 185, at 5 pound intervals, plus heavyweight. The interfraternity meet will be held March 9. Entries close March 2, while the weigh-in will be March 8.

For the dorm and town groups, the following weights will be contested: 121, 128, 136, 145, 150, 155, 165, 175, and heavyweight.

The dorm meet will be held March 11; entries close March 4, and the weigh-in will be March 10. The town group meet is scheduled for March 16; entries close March 9, and the weigh-in date is March 15.

First and second place teams will be awarded cups; medals will be given to individual winners. All bouts are to be five minutes long; points will be scored on the basis of: match winner, 5; second place, 3; and 1 point for each fall.
