Air Base Cager Has 246 Points

A-1C Bill Howerton of the Griffiss Air Force Base basketball team tallied 246 points in a dozen games this season and made off with the individual scoring championship of the Industrial Basketball League. Howerton, who hails from Wash-

ington, Okla., had 98 field goals and 50 foul conversions in averaging 20 and a half points a game for the runnerup Air Base quintet. The league championship went to the Rome Moose Club.

Assigned to Rome Air Force Depot, the 6'2 Howerton, who serves as player-coach, is a veteran of overseas service. Clarence Beasley, also an air-
