Gordon scores a big victory — at last

If Phil Gordon planned to surprise a few key opponents during this high school wrestling season, he can forget about it.

The Rush-Henrietta senior turned some heads after he won the 130-pound division Wednesday at the 39th annual Teike-Bernabi Tournament in Spencerport.

Gordon won 29 matches last season for the Royal Comets, but none during the finals of Section V's showcase events such as the state tournament qualifier, or even the Monroe County league tournament.

"He was on that fringe but didn't win the big events," Rush-Henrietta coach Mickey Marlowe said. "He's always been a steady wrestler, a great kid.

son. Right now, he's a little bit under the radar."

Gordon's 2-1 victory over Barry Thrush from Athens, a high school in Pennsylvania, should be an attention-grabber.

While the Teike-Bernabi Tournament is not the sectionals, it is an event that hosted 14 wrestlers who placed in the 2004 New York state high school tournament.

"The numbers speak for themselves," Geneva senior 152pounder Mark Bloom said. "Fourteen placers in the tournament, and I know a bunch of kids on the Athens team were state finalists or champions."

Bloom won the matchup of the night, a 6-3 decision in the 152 final over Wayne's Nathan Patterson.

The only previous losses in Patterson's 19 matches this season were to Gillespie.
