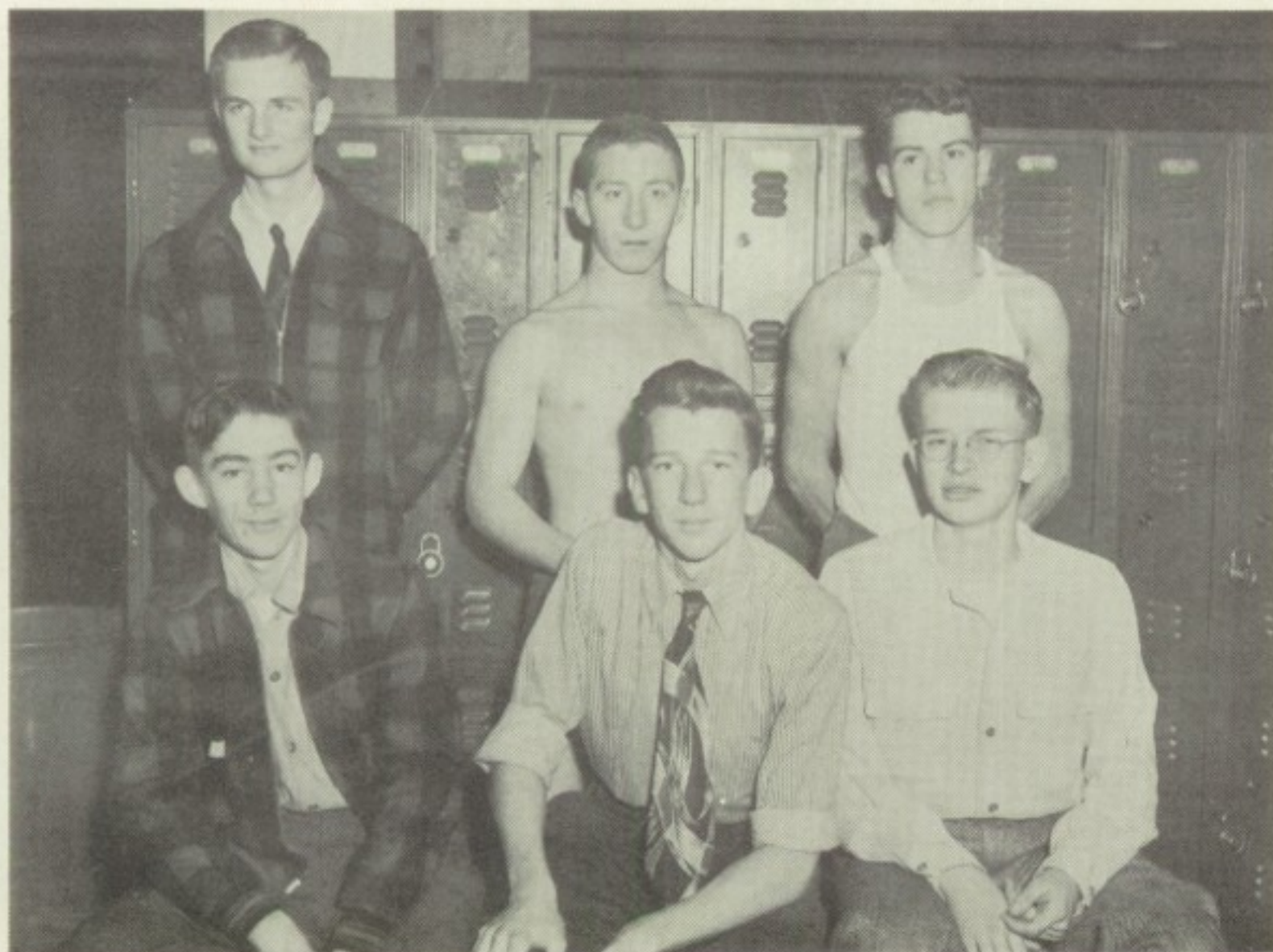
Wrestling

Cross Country

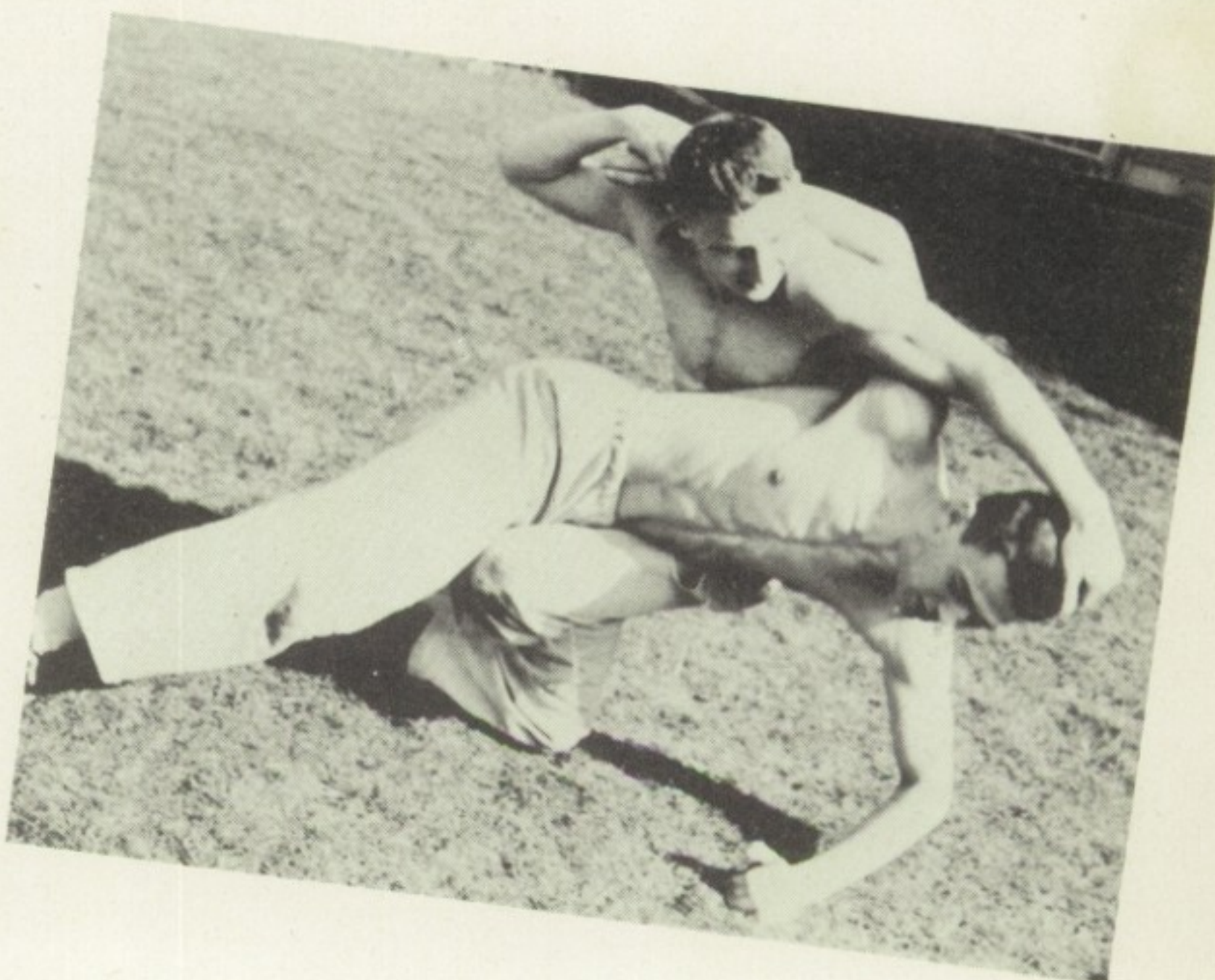
