## MEET THE GRAPPLERS

Following four winning seasons during which the Rochester Institute of Technology varsity wrestling squad compiled an overall 38-10-1 record, the tide has turned for Tiger mentor Earl Fuller who is now faced with the tough chore of building a winner around only three returning lettermen.

Gone from RIT mat wars are such student performers as Ramon West, Jim Kennedy, Chuck Missakian, and Dick Zoyhofski. In their stead is a lineup which shows only two seniors in the first 10.

Co-captaining this year's squad, which lists four sophomores and four juniors on its roster, are veterans Dave Egan, good little 130-pounder from Spencerport; and big, tough Dave Zoyhofski, rugged heavyweight from Orchard Park. Only other returning letterman to this year's team is 167-pound Jerry Hetjmanek of Little Falls. All three are outstanding grapplers, and are expected to carry the load for the Tigers through a tough 13-mat slate in '61-62.

Other expected starters for the Blue and Gray are: 123, Joe Lanzisera of Seaford, Ed Moshey of Rochester or Bill Cain of Toledo, Ohio; 147, Harry Gaugae of Port Crane, and Joel Crytzer of Natrona Heights, Pa.; 157, Dan Hedberg, Rochester; and heavyweight Burt Salk, Oceanside.

Coach Fuller, realizing the scope of the rebuilding job ahead of him, says, "we've lost a lot through graduation and some of the boys we were counting on from last year's frosh squad are now out of the picture. Nonetheless, these boys are anxious to learn, and I'm sure will give a good accounting of themselves in their baptism under fire this season."

Assisting Fuller with the coaching duties this season are two former varsity performers Jim Kennedy and Tom Dollar. Both bring a wealth of experience to the job.

A tough schedule is an understatement as one looks ahead to the Tigers' mat opponents this season. Along with traditionally tough opponents like small college powers Lock Haven State, Waynesburg and Bloomsburg State, the Tigers this year will also tangle with powerful Cornell University and midwestern top-ranked Winona State of Minnesota. Other traditional rivals on the RIT schedule include Case Tech, Clarkson, University of Buffalo, Ithaca College and Cortland State.

### SUMMARY

The road back will be long and rocky for a green, inexperienced squad and a winning season would be a most pleasant surprise. However, Coach Fuller can be expected to get the maximum from this squad as he points for better times ahead.

All home basketball and wrestling contests start at 8:30, freshmen at 6:30. All home fencing matches start at 12 noon.
