
OSWEGO GRAPPLERS CAPTURE TWO AT HOME; BEAT ALBANY STATE 29-2, BROCKPORT 27-10



Ithaca Stops Laker Hoopsters, 72-67

Wednesday evening the Oswego basketball teams travelled to Ithaca College to take on the Ithaca Bombers in non-conference tilts. Either Laker squad was able to bring home the bacon.

The Varsity dropped a 72-67 thriller that saw the Lakers in the ball game all the way. The Glinskimen came from behind to tie the score 35-35 at halftime, but they couldn't keep the fire alive. Bomber big boys Dave Barton and Dave Hanlin each poured in 18 points for the winners.

Coach Glinski saw one bright spot though in the Lakers' performance. Sophomore Bernie Fuller had his best night of the year as he led the Oswego attack with 22 points. Fuller's strength makes hopes even brighter for a Winter Weekend win over Buffalo State tomorrow afternoon.

A victory over Buffalo, which is tied with Oswego for second place in the conference, will not eliminate Buffalo from title contention. but it will make it nearly possible for the Queen City delegation to cop the title.

Furrer Wins Number 41

Coach Jim Howard's wrestlers came home after a road which took them into the home territory of Lock Haven, now ranked among the nation's top ten small colleges in wrestling, and always dangerous Buffalo. And they got a royal welcome as capacity crowds turned out to see them extend their record to 10-1 by downing Albany and Brodkport.

The Lakers handily handed Albany a 29-2 setback. The Green and Gold men did not lose a single match; Albany's two points came on a draw between Frank De-Marco and Lee Comeau for the 137 pound event.

Frank Wins First

Frank Frisicano brought the crowd to their feet early in the meet as he felled his opponent at 4:24. It was his first pin in five matches this season.

Eugene Monaco, Albany's winningest grappler with a 9-0 record coming into the Oswego meet, was the victim of a 5-1 decision to Brian Jones. Jones was wrestling the 130 point class for the first time. Harry Furrer, Oswego's 130 pound ace, was watching the meet from the sidelines with a strained ankle muscle.

After DeMarco's draw, Dick Shiel and Bob Williams worked 6-4 and 6-0 decisions from their respectve mat foes.

Down by a 21-2 score, Albany had the final leg kicked out from under the chair when Pete Hoffman fell prey to Tom Gustainis. In one of the best matches he has had this year, Gustainis drops his man in 1:59.

finished out the day easily as Terry Ryan pinned Ted Cszymanski in 8:57 and Bill Cousins rolled Bob Robelotto, and Albany senior, to a lopsided 12-2 decision for reading.

Brockport, supporting a 5-4 record, fared somewhat better by mustering 10 points in their losing cause.

Steve Mullady picked up his third win in five matches when he won the 115 pound class by a 5-4 decision. Brockport's Skip Sutton put a good fight but couldn't outlast the scrappy Mull-

The score continued to mount. Jones won a 5-0 decision, Shiel and Williams scored falls at 5:30 and 0:39 respectively, Custainis battled to a 2-2 draw with junior Bill Mull, and Ryan won an easy decision before the Bald Eagles were able to win a match.

An upset came when Andy Garey dropped a hard fought 9-6 decision to sophomore Dan Hodack who had only recently joined the wrestling squad. Hodack had played football in high school and this year for Brockport, but had no interscholastic competitive experience. Garey led until midway through the second period when Hodack scored a take down and a near fall and was able to protect his lead throughout the third period.

Carl Reistrom, wrestling far above his weight, was then pinned by Brockport heavyweight Steve Teisa at 2:24 to round out the Brockport scoring.

State Meet Tomorrow

The Laker grapplers will spend tomorrow in Brockport for the S.U.N.Y.A.C. meet. They will conclude the season next weekend with home meets against Montclair State on Friday and Ithaca College on Saturday.


