Brockport Matmen Second In State Tourney Turner, Beers, Buntich - State Champs Spring Football. Men's Intramurals The standings and leading

Brockport State traveled to Cordland last Saturday for the State University of New York Wrestling Championships. The Eagles fared well, taking second place overall and bringing back to Brockport three individual firsts. Coach Roscoe Hastings' mattmen totalled 74 points to edge out: Oneonta by one, but fell short of the 83 compiled by Sweezo.

Regan Beers extended his unbeaten skein to 26 straight which covers', the past two seasons. Only a sophomore, Beers took the heavyweight title by pinning his man in the final. He earlier



decisioned his opponent in the second rourd 8-2. Brockports only two-time State Champion Bruce Turner captured the 167 pound class in one of the finest matches of the tournament. At the and of regulation-time, the match was all even, 6-6, and went into a three minute overtime-period. Turner bested his opponent, who placed third in the small college nationals last

year, 3-2 to win the crown. He had previously pinned his first two opponents in the second period. Turner's overall record for the season shows 15 wins and no defeats. Brockport's third State Champion is Tom Buntich who captured the 160 pound class. Buntich went into the tournament withe a 7-2-1 season record. He won his first match 6-3. his second 11-4, and took his first State title with a 7-2 decision in the final. Buntich is also only a sophomore, which indicates that next year's team should be a strong contender for the Conference championship.

Senior Bob DeMarsh placed second in the tournament, when, he was decisioned in the finals, 4-1, He had earlier won 22-4 in the second round. Don Mueray had to default in the 130 pound class-because of torn cartiliger in his ribs. At 145, Tom Holmes placed fourth following a first round victory and a second round loss: At 152, Joe Waitword took fourth place as he won his first round match and lost his second. A pleasant surprise for Brockport was the fine showing of Sophomore Bill, Brodmerkel in the 177 pound cleas. He pinned his first opponent in the second period, won a 6-0 decision in the second round before losing to last year's state champ in the finals, 7-0. Charlie Bolesh also made it to the finals in the 191pound class, after pinning his first opponent, and taking an 8-5 decision over his second. He losi in the finals 9-2

It was a fine showing for the matmen, although it wasn't the State Championship the team had hoped to win. They placed second to a team they had earlier beaten decisively, Oswego, and barly edged out Onconta, whom they had also beaten during the regular season. Congratulations, go to each member of the team and to their coach, Rosce Hasting; who led the team to their finest season in the history of the college.
