Winning seven, and losing only one meet to a veteran Syracuse team, St. Lawrence had one of the outstanding teams in this section of the country this year. George Benz and Hayward Plumadore, outstanding sophomore grapplers, were undefeated throughout the entire season. Benz received the bronze plaque awarded each year to the man on the team with the most perfect record.

The team swept off to a good start by defeating East Stroudsburg Teachers 25 to 4 early in January. The following week the Larrys met their only loss in a close meet with Syracuse 11 to 21. Under the handicap of having to wrestle Canadian rules the team got back in stride by winning over Queens University 34 to 0 and also Toronto University 35 to 1.

Continuing their string of victories the Laurentian grapplers took over Colgate 23 to 9. On the western New York trip the Scarlet and Brown team won every match but one by falls to total a score of 38 to 0 against Alfred University. The following meet they defeated Ithaca Y. M. C. A. in a close meet 19½ to 10½. The final match of the year with Brooklyn Poly was easily won by the Larrys 30 to 6.

Plumadore established a college record in the Queens meet by throwing his man in 23 seconds, in three of his other he scored falls in less than 40 seconds. Benz and Hauser also scored rapid falls over their opponents in some matches. Roy Clogston's record team will lose three men with graduation in June: Zabriskie in the 126 pound class, Hauser in the 175, and Java in the unlimited.
