

# Mynderse, Waterloo Pace Class B Section 5 Wrestling Quarterfinalists

Mynderse Academy and Waterloo will lead wrestlers from pre-quarterfinals at Clifton Springs and Wayne Central into Section 5 Class B quarterfinal action at Mynderse, Saturday.

Mynderse placed seven in the quarterfinals after action at Clifton Springs, while Phelps will have four and Victor one.

Waterloo puts six into the quarterfinals as a result of action at Wayne Central. The host school has five quarterfinalists and Marion has one.

The survivors at Clifton and Wayne will be joined by the 12 winners from Dundee, Tuesday, including five from Odessa, four from Penn Yan, two from Trumansburg and one from Dundee.

At Clifton Springs, last night, two bouts drew most of the attention. In the 180 pound division, Pat Cummings of Mynderse avenged an earlier loss when he decisioned Ron Hilfiker

of Phelps in a preliminary match, 7-5. Earlier, Hilfiker had knocked off Cummings.

The second big match found two undefeated wrestlers squaring off. Charlies Shoemaker of Victor, winner of 11 straight, took a 5-0 lead as he bowled over unbeaten Bill Pagano of Mynderse and had a near fall. Pagano, however, recovered from the initial shock and went on to score an 8-6 decision over the Victor heavyweight.

Closest match of the tourney was at 103 in the preliminary bout where Mike Ottley of Phelps and Al Ramsay of Victor battled to a 4-4 tie in regulation and to a scoreless tie in overtime. Ottley was declared the winner on a referee's decision.

Victor's lone survivor is Jay Wendell, who has won 13 of 14 bouts this year.

Joining Cummings and Pagano for Mynderse are Al Hurd at 112; Jim Wilcox at 127; John

Swan at 133; Aage Hansen at 154, and Jack Stubbs at 165.

Phelps winners are Lee DeRuyter, at 95; Mike Ottley at 103; Rodger Burnisky at 120 and Dennis Costan at 145.

Two upsets marked the action at Wayne Central. At 138, Bill Dobbin of Waterloo surprised Dan Switzer of Wayne, 3-1 in overtime and at 145, Kevin Cass stunned Jerry Marshall of Waterloo, 7-5.

Waterloo Coach Gordon Gilfillian, however, got some bad news today concerning Marshall that may also have an effect on Cass. Marshall is feared to have the mumps, Gilfillian said.

Along with Dobbin, other Waterloo quarterfinalists are Gary McLaughlin at 112; George Lamson at 120, Joe Capone at 127, Bob Kime at 133 and Dick Zukowski at 180.

Wayne Central quarterfinalists include Dale Hill at 95, Paul Dutcher at 103; Cass at 145;

Ralph Moak at 165 and Bill Laird at unlimited.

Tom Logue became Marion's only quarterfinalist, winning at 154.

Winners yesterday will square off with winners from Dundee, Tuesday, beginning at 6 p. m., Saturday, at Mynderse Academy.
