WRESTLING PREVIEW

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With several wrestlers who lack experience, but several, also, who have great potential, Coach Earl Fuller says, "This year is a big question mark."

Gone from last year's squad are Dave Egan, who won 10 of 13 matches in the 130-pound class and heavyweight Dave Zoyhofski, who won five matches before becoming injured.

If RIT is to have a successful season and return to the lofty plateau it has held in 11 of Fuller's 13 seasons at the Institute, Fuller feels wrestlers in five divisions must come through with consistent victories. And he hopes to pick up a victory in one of the other weight classes in each meet as well.

Fuller has high hopes for the 123-pound class with sophomore Doug Drake; 130, with letterman Joe Lanzisera or Roy Peck; 137, with Chuck Caleo; 147, with letterman Ed Moshey, Dick Dawson or Roy Hiler, and 177, with captain and two-time letter-winner Jerry Hetjmanek.

Other front-line wrestlers on the squad are letter man Leigh Stewart and Lou Bombace, 147 pounds; Carleton Allen, 157 pounds; LaVerne Biehler, 167 pounds, and heavyweight Charles Kulher.

After the Christmas recess, he'll have 115pounder Pat Scarlatta and 157-pounder James Chapin.

Captain Hetjmanek, who won 7, lost 5, a year ago, "has a lot of potential and always seems just on the verge of becoming a great wrestler," savs Fuller. The coach hopes he attains the goal this season.

Sophomore Caleo, a runner-up at the West Point Freshman Invitational last year, "should be one of our shining spots this year," says Fuller.

Drake and Hiler, former Section 5 high school champions, and Dawson, are three "very promising sophomores."

But the schedule is not an easy one. Cornell, Waynesburg, Bloomsburg, Lock Haven and Lycoming appear to be the major obstacles in improving upon last year's 4–9 record.

And then, there are old rivals Cortland, Oswego, Buffalo, Ithaca, Hartwick, Clarkson and Case.

Assisting Fuller this year and concentrating primarily with the Freshman Wrestling Team is Bob Bryan, a former RIT wrestler.

SUMMARY

As Coach Fuller says, it's a "question" season, bu only a pessimist would doubt that the team won't improve upon last year's 4-9 record. Wrestling has had it's "off-year." Fuller will again be building, but he'll be getting victories, too.
