# N. Genesee Cops Mat Tournament

Capturing five of the 12 individual championships the West Genesee School wrestling team of Canisius won the second annual Auburn Invitational Wrestling Tournament staged all day Friday at Burn Community College gymnasium.

The champs took the title with points while Rome Free Academy came in second with 72 pts.

The Maroon matmen had only one grappler in the finals. Rugged Bob Carris defeated two opponents in the unlimited class to gain the title where he lost out in a close decision to Dick Moore of Geneva. Auburn was also hampered by the loss of its 103-pound section 3 champ and last year's tournament winner Andy Roberts who suffered knee injury and was unable to compete.

## Finishes Third

Kurt Kuppinger of Auburn finished in third place in the 145-pound division after winning two matches and losing one.

Hugh Moyer of Oneida was awarded the trophy as the outstanding wrestler of the tournament. Dick Post of Geneva scored the fastest pin of the tourney when he threw Dale Brintall of West Genesee in 22 seconds in a semi-final 165-pound class.

West Genesee, coached by Jim

Menapace, sent seven men into the finals while Rome had five and Geneva placed three.

The victors won final matches in the 112 pound class, Paul Forward; 120, John Bower; 127, Bill Bower; 138, Jim Mento; 133, William Cole.
