# Section 5 Wrestling Quarterfinals Slated Saturday

Four area wrestlers will be trying to take a big step toward second Section 5 wrestling shield tomorrow when quarterfinal tournaments are held at Canandaigua and Odessa.

At Canandaigua, Class A teams, including Geneva, Mynderse, Waterloo, Penn Yan, Canandaigua, Newark and Wayne Central will swing into action in the Wayne-Finger Lakes quarterfinal test with Geneva's Dave VanGordon seeking a repeat as the 154 pound king and Tony Addante of Canandaigua, will be gunning for the 133 pound title after winning at 120 pounds last year.

At Odessa, survivors of two pre-quarterfinals will move into action. The 24 survivors from triangular meets at Clifton Springs and Trumansburg, will be competing in the Class B quarterfinal. Here, Jay Wendell of Victor, 138 pound champ last year, goes after the 145 pound title and Dennis Coston of Phelps, 145 pound kingpin last year, will be shooting for the 154 pound title.

Semi-finals and finals in both the Class A and Class B tournaments will be held next Saturday; the Class A bouts set for Corning East High with the semi-finals at 2 p. m. and the finals at 8 p. m. Semi-finals and finals in the Class B meet will be held at Victor.

In the Class A quarterfinal, tomorrow, seven Wayne-Finger Lakes tournament champ-

ions will be in action and all are favored to come through again and move into the semi-finals.

Among these are Lou Gillotte, Geneva's 95 pounder; Pete Achilles, 103 pound Panther; Jeff Parkman of Penn Yan at 112; Mike Lynn of Penn Yan at 120; Van Gordon at 154; Wayne Klue of Geneva at 165, and Bill LaRock of Penn Yan at 180.

Geneva, conference champion, will be favored in four bouts, with Gillotte, Pete Achilles, VanGordon and Klue. Gillotte probably will get a good test from Bill Winship, who was runner-up to Lou in the tournament.

Parkman and Lynn of Penn Yan also face stern tests, Parkman involved in the same bracket as Waterloo's Bill Stanton, and Lynn having to look forward to Newark's Joe Lawrence.

Addante is the favorite at 133 pounds but Andy Dennison of Wayne Central represents a real threat along with Jim Wilcox of Mynderse.

Paul Stratton of Mynderse and Dick Abrams of Wayne are the top contenders at 138 pounds along with Geneva's Bruce Davie.

Ed Zukowski of Waterloo is the strong contender in the 145 pound division, but Dan Switzer of Wayne and Nick Gallina of Mynderse represent strong challenges.

VanGordon is a big choice at 154, but either Ange Hansen of Mynderse and Dick Mulberger

of Penn Yan, could be trouble.

Klue faces a tough test from Jack Stubbs of Mynderse at 165 pounds while Bill LaRock of Penn Yan seems to be the class of the 180 pound division.

In the heavyweight branch, Bob Bellomo of Mynderse is the top choice with Bill Vogt of Geneva and Stu Monje of Newark representing the top challenges.

Action starts at 11 a. m. with the semi-finals listed for 2 p. m. and the finals at 8 p. m. There is a possibility that consolation bouts will be held at 6:30 p. m. if time permits.

The Class B quarterfinal at Odessa will start at 7 p. m. That group has already cut down its list of candidates to 24 for the 12 titles. Results of the pre-quarterfinal and pairings appeared in Thursday's Geneva Times.

ROCHESTER, N.Y. (AP) — Only one of the four title battles in this weekend's North American Figure Skating Championships actually is expected to be between the United States and Canada.

Petra Burka of Toronto and Peggy Fleming of Pasadena, Calif., are the favorites in ladies' singles, but the other three events — men's singles, pairs and ice dancing — figure to be repeats of last week's U.S. Championships at Lake Placid, N.Y.

Gary Visonti of Detroit and Scott Ethan Allen of Smoke Rise, N.J., are the favorites in men's singles; Ronald and Vivian Joseph of Highland Park, Ill., and Ronald and Cynthia

Kauffman of Seattle are the top choices in pairs, and Kristin Fortune of Northridge, Calif., and Dennis Sveum of Sun Valley, Calif., and Lorna Dyer and John Carrell, both of Seattle, are the ones to beat in ice dancing.

Visconti hopes to repeat his startling upset of Allen and put himself in the world title picture, while Allen needs a victory to regain the prestige lost in last week's setback.
