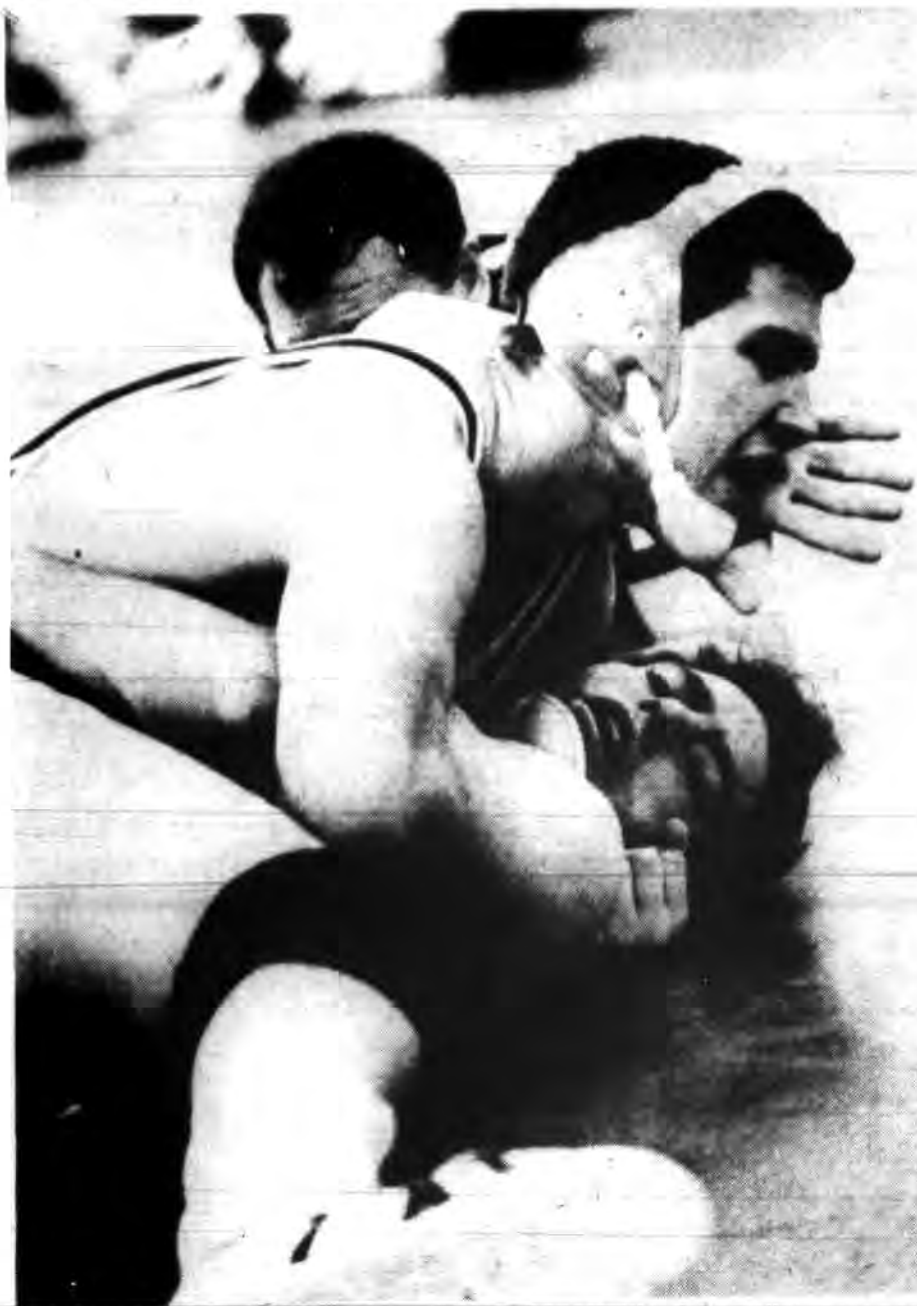


Lyndonville Grapplers Romp To MHS Tourney Title

Averaging seven pins per outing, Lyndonville High romped past three straight opponents Saturday to win the Medina Wrestling Tournament

for the second time in three years. Lyndonville belted Genesee Region League rival Pavilion 51-18 in the championship match. Earlier

Rams Place 4th In Tourney

WILLIAMSVILLE — Roy-Hart took fourth place in a very talented field at the Williamsville North Wrestling Tournament here Saturday.

Fulton took top team honors with 168 points followed by Spencerport with 156, Clarence 92, Roy-Hart 86, Pioneer 81½, Niagara-Wheatfield 79, Williamsville North 73 and Starpoint 58.

Roy-Hart Junior Lou Rosselli, who earned the tourney's Most Valuable Wrestler award, earned the lone first place finish for Roy-Hart in the varsity competition.

Making it 42 wins in a row Rosselli (112), whose career mark now stands at 89-7, pinned Joe Loprestti of Spencerport in 1:57 in his title

the quarterfinals and then decided Fulton's Rich Pawlewicz 6-1 in the semis.

The Rams also had two second place finishers in the varsity competition in Rob Jacquin (91) and Nelson Colley (119).

Jacquin lost 14-4 in the finals to Fulton's Jim Flynn after decisioning Mike Jones of Niagara-Wheatfield 4-2 in the quarterfinals and Lance Beck of Pioneer 17-0 in the semis.

Colley bowed 15-0 to Matt Woodworth of Fulton in his title match after decisioning Starpoint's Dave Marshall 15-1 in the quarterfinals and pinning Pioneer's Chuck Nourse in 4:25 in the semis.

In the JV competition for Roy-Hart, Jerry Behe (177) registered three pins to earn a first place finish

in the day the Tigers, who are now 6-0 overall on the season, defeated Eden 54-10 in the quarterfinals and Medina 51-13 in the semifinals.

Seven Tiger grapplers went undefeated on the day including Dave Wells (126) and Jackie Stewart (215), who both pinned all three of their opponents, along with Rick Siebert (105), Jeff Newman (98), Jamie Harrold (138), Gary Bayne (145) and Chris Siebert (155). Rick and Chris Siebert along with Bayne are all 6-0 on the young season.

"The kids were pumped up," said Tigers first year Coach Brian Gawne. "The kids knew what they had to do and they went out and did it."

Medina defeated Turner-Carroll 54-9 in the quarterfinals and North Tonawanda 39-30 in the wrestle backs before bowing 51-12 to Lew-Port in the match for third place.

Brian Southcott went undefeated on the day for MHS to raise his season record to 6-0.

A first period pin by Rick Siebert and a forfeit gave Lyndonville a quick 12-0 lead but Pavilion rallied to briefly tie the match on pins by Arturo Martinez (112) and John Bannister (119).

Back to back pins by Wells and Randy Klopp (132), however, put Lyndonville right back on top to stay at 24-12. A decision win by Harrold followed by pins by Bayne and Chris Siebert upped the Tigers advantage to a commanding 39-12 margin. A first period pin by Stewart later capped off the big win for the Tigers, who also claimed the tourney title in 1984.

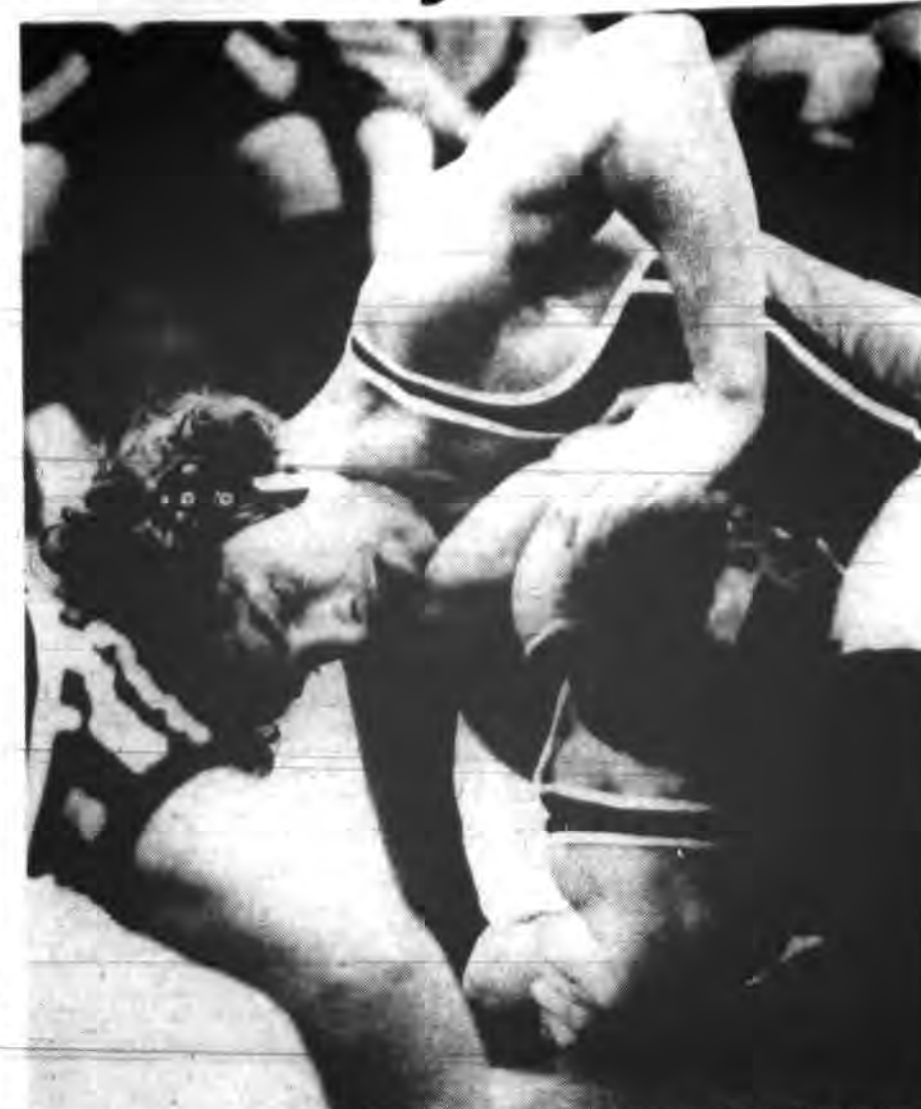
Southcott had the lone pin for Medina.
