

Notre Dame Repeats In All-Catholic

LOCKPORT — Three Notre Dame of Batavia wrestlers regained All-Catholic titles they won last year and the Little Irish repeated as A-C team champion by scoring 130½ points in the Msgr. Martin Assn. meet at DeSales High School.

Rick Tresco won the 105-pound crown for the second straight year by pinning Neumann's Tom Pfentner at 1:46. Teammate Mike Hughes, unbeaten since his sophomore year, decisioned Dougherty's Vito Passero, 7-2, to earn the 119-pound crown and repeat. At 145 pounds, Andy Cordes gained his second straight A-C championship with a 5-2 decision over DeSales' Al Giles.

Four other Notre Dame wrestlers emerged as champions. They were Mark Mullen (88 pounds), Paul Sullivan (98), Tom Marchese (126) and Joe Darby (117).

Kathy McQuaid Win Four Events

SYRACUSE — Kathy McQuaid of the Water Buffalo Swim Club won four events and set a meet record in the 400-yard individual medley event for girls 11-and-12 Saturday in the Syracuse Charger Invitational Swim Meet. The WBSC won the team crown with 175 points.

Miss McQuaid's record time in the individual medley event was 5:24.8. She also won the 200 freestyle in 2:16.2, the 100 breaststroke in 1:16.8, and the 100 butterfly in 1:08.2.

Cheryl Carpenter of the WBSC won the open girls' 200 freestyle in 2:06.9. In the 11-12 boys' age group, Andy Cohen finished first in the 400-yard individual medley in 5:28.5, and won the 100 breaststroke in 1:23.5.

The WBSC's 13-14 boys' 400 medley and free relay teams won both events. Swimmers were Scott Croff, Peter McQuaid Sam O'Leary and Roger Levine. The quartet won the medley in 4:25.9, and the 400 freestyle event in 3:52.8.

Sweet Home Matmen, Izard Capture Division I Laurels

Sweet Home piled up 79 points to grab the team title — its second in three years — and the Panthers' Dave Izard copped the 155-pound class crown and was named the outstanding wrestler of the Section VI Division I wrestling championship meet Saturday night at Kenmore East.

Sweet Home won the Division I mat crown in 1972. Maryvale finished second in the team race with 65½ points, while the defending champion host school took third with 64 points.

The winner and runner-up in each weight bracket advance to the Section VI championships next Friday and Saturday at Sweet Home.

Izard will carry a 19-3 record into the sectional title round. He scored three straight victories Saturday.

Niagara-Wheatfield Snares Sixth Crown

Paul Cianchetti and Jim Briggs won individual sectional crowns for the second straight year and Niagara-Wheatfield won its sixth straight — the Division III team title — with a total of 109½ points at Lake Shore.

Cianchetti scored a pin over Steve Marone at 2:32 to emerge the 170-pound champion, while Jim Briggs took the unlimited championship by decisioning Dave Dombrowski of Williamsville South, 3-2. The Falcons also had two other champions—Jim Hauer at 108 pounds and Russ Kolthan at 180.

Clarence nipped Tonawanda by a point to finish second with 66.

Williamsville South's Mitch Brown won his second straight title — this one at 148 pounds. He pinned N-W's Tom Pittman at 2:48. Brown, for the second time in as many years, was also named the most outstanding wrestler.

Amherst's Mike Foster was named the meet's outstanding wrestler and North's Tim McGee was given the award for the most pins in the least amount of time. Foster won the 148-pound class over several top-rated foes while McGee pinned his three opponents in a total time of 8:33.
