Porter scored an 11-0 decision to advance and keep his own perfect campaign intact at 37-0 (after the title bout with Sanger).

One might wonder then, with Porter dominating his opponents the way he has, why Ninos is concerned.

JUST HOW much has Porter dominated his opposition this year?

Only Pembroke's Chad Smith has managed to score against him.

"I've had to convince Kenny that he can't afford to take anybody lightly," said Ninos. "Chad was a virtual unknown before Kenny saw him in the Class D meet last week.'

Porter, however, should have a very clear picture of who and what kind of competition he'll see next week in the state championships.

Having wrestled most of this season at 155 and 145, Porter heads into the state meet as the top-ranked 145-pounder in the state.

Porter could see some familiar faces next week-7-25-91 end.
