

Palovcsik Earns Crown, Carr, Schalles Selected

ERIE — Norm Palovcsik of Clearfield, wrestling for the Erie YMCA won his second title in as many weeks Sunday in the open division of the second annual Great Lakes Tournament

The ex-PIAA champ who now is on the Penn State squad walked off with top honors at 140 points as he defeated Dale Murdock of the Gold Eagle Athletic Club by a 7-2 score in the finals. Murdock is a stand-out lightweight for Clarion State College

Palovcsik reached the finals by pinning Frank Gresh of Girard in 55 seconds and Bill Cresler of Newport in 3.25 and besting Tony D'Giovana of Kenston (Ohio) 19-11. D'Giovana was fifth in the U. S. World Games trials.

Bob Gordon, who received his diploma at Clearfield this month and is headed for Clarion State College, lost in the intermediate class heavyweight finals. Chuck Corryea of Reynolds a 250-pounder, pinned Gordon in 3:59. Gordon had pinned Allen Segedy of Chagrin Falls (Ohio) in the semis.

Other area wrestlers who competed included Ron Selfridge, Lon Soult Jr., Marty Evans and Lon Soult Sr. of Clearfield and Brad Bennett and Rod Barrett of Curwensville.

Named the outstanding wrestlers were Jimmy Carr of Erie in the intermediate class and Wade Schalles of the Erie YMCA in the open division. Carr won at 120 in both the intermediate and open classes. Schalles, Clarion State College matman from Hollidaysburg posted four falls including a 5:32 job on three-time NAIA champ Roy Washington of Rochester (N.Y.) in the finals.

Sportsmanship awards went to Brian Raub of Greenville, intermediate, and D'Giovana open.

The Erie YMCA easily topped the team trophy with 100 points. The Golden Eagle AC was second.

There were 220 wrestlers in the intermediate class and 140 in the open division.

Many of the wrestlers will be entering the first annual Tyrone Recreation Tournament July 17 and 18 and the first annual Progress Summer Tournament July 31 at Clearfield.
