Wrestlers Pin Down Best Season Ever LaRock NCAA Finalist


Paced by the incomparable Jim LaRock, who has never been defeated in dual competition, "Whitey" Coles' grapplers lost only to Cortland, after having defeated them once, and to strong Loch Haven.

Injuries plagued the Colemen as Co-Capt. Dick Hover and Jack Hantz were lost a good part of the season. Heavyweight Ev Cameron came along to establish himself as a good heavyweight. Danny Coletta and Lyall Fletcher gave good accounts of

themselves while Bill Brickey and Fred March gave indications that they will bear watching another year.

Jim La Rock moved up to take the 4-I 165 pound title after winning the 155 pound crown last year. In the N.C.A.A. at Cedar Rapids, lowa Jim lost 10-7 in the finals after having his opponent nearly pinned. In the National A.A.U. meet at Hempstead Jim finished third. La Rock and H. Dunn of the Frosh squad won the 165 and heavyweight titles respectively in the Niagara District A.A.U. meet.






Front Row: Hantz, Godici, Co-Capt. Hover, Brickey, March.
