In regular season competition the Bald Eagles wan seven out of nine meets against very worthy opposition. The only two defeats were at the hands of the University of Pittsburgh and Waynesburg College.

Coach Hubert Jack's grapplers entered the Wilkes College Tournament on December 28-29 and won a very respectable second place behind the powerful Pitt Panthers—one of the top teams in the East.

The Bald Eagles are looking forward to the post-season wrestling tournaments which begin with the STC tournament held at Lock Haven, February 23. Newspaper experts have picked the Bald Eagles to repeat as team champions.

Following the STC tournament, the Bald Eagles will journey to Cleveland for the 4-I tournament again this year, which will be followed by the National Collegiate Athletic Association tournament, held in Pittsburgh.


